Pricing Accuracy Inspection Policy

Frequency of Inspections:

- 1) Normal Inspections Supermarkets will be annually, all others will be biannually.
- 2) Complaint Inspections As soon as previously scheduled work permits.
- 3) Reinspections Seven days after the failed inspection.
- 4) All Inspections will follow the inspection procedures in NIST Handbook 130.

Number of Items Scanned (based on the size of the store):

- 1) Supermarkets 100 500, Single Stage Sample Procedure.
- 2) Drug Stores 50 200, 2 Stage Sample Procedure (HB 130, Table 1, Page 199)
- 3) Dollar Stores 50 200, 2 Stage Sample Procedure (HB 130, Table 1, Page 199)
- 4) Convenience Stores 25 50, 2 Stage Sample Procedure (HB 130, Table 1, Page 199)
- 5) Variety Stores 25 50, 2 Stage Sample Procedure (HB 130, Table 1, Page 199)
- Sporting Goods Stores 25 50, 2 Stage Sample Procedure (HB 130, Table 1, Page 199)
- 7) Hardware Stores 25 100, 2 Stage Sample Procedure (HB 130, Table 1, Page 199)

Over-Charge Violations:

- 1) Over-Charges will count in the Scanner Accuracy Inspection Average.
- 2) Penalties will be assessed for each violation at \$200.00 per violation.

Under-Charge Violations:

- 1) Under-Charges will count in the Scanner Accuracy Inspection Average.
- 2) Penalties will not be assessed for Under-Charge Violations.
- 3) Intentional Under-Charges will not be counted as errors with verification from the store manager.

Shelf Tag Violations

 Missing, Out Dated or Inaccurate Shelf Tag Violation penalties will be assessed at \$200.00 per violation.
