I am submitting the following Purchase of Services Agreement for review and approval by the Board of Legislators per Board Resolutions and Local Law #3 of 2001, amending Article VIII, Section 802 of the Administrative Code.

The Oneida County Department of Social Services has a need to improve housing for Social Services clients in the City of Utica from that which presently exists in some areas. The enclosed Purchase of Services Agreement between Oneida County Department of Social Services and the City of Utica continues the Housing Improvement Program for Utica.

The goals of the program are as follows:

1. To improve the quality, affordability and adequacy of the housing for Social Services clients in the City of Utica.
2. To ensure codes compliance and improvement of deteriorating housing in the City of Utica so that Public Assistance recipients are assured of housing that is safe and will meet the needs of the family.
3. To provide a total analysis of all housing stock which would be most likely available to Social Services clients.
4. To identify and provide assistance including the establishment of a training program for those tenants who are chronic abusers of real estate through the use of housing improvement and home management services.
5. To identify Landlords who are abusing the system and to develop policies and protocols with the Department including possible legal action to correct this problem.



The Agreement has a term of 3/10/08 - 3/09/09, at a total cost not to exceed \$ 464,000.00 and provides for 1 full-time Chief Housing Inspector, 1 full-time Senior Housing Inspector, 6 full-time Housing Code Inspectors, 1 Senior Account Clerk Typist and 2 Data Entry Machine Operator. The City received 1,429 referrals in 2007. The City of Utica pays 100% of the local share of the contract.



Past performance Served: Initial Contract 11/10/94, Inspections began 2/1/95. The project has been successful in improving the housing for Social Services recipients. The total Budgeted cost of last year's contract was \$ 452,666. The City of Utica is contributing 100% of the local cost of this contract for the fifth year. There is no County dollars used to support this effort.

O.C. Department Staff Comments:

In addition to the services listed in the contract the housing specialists have also supplied the Department Investigative Unit with information regarding inconsistencies in living arrangements and resources while at the same time providing information to services regarding possible neglect or abuse of children or adults.

During 2007 the Codes project received 1,429 referrals from the Department which resulted in 1,144 inspections with the following inspection results, 1,025 were found in compliance, 50 were found to have no serious violations and 69 were reported with serious violations, 5 cases went to court.

Efforts have been stepped up since 2006 with the posting of Not To Be Occupied dwellings of Owner Occupied homes and apartment buildings. Warrants have had to be procured, alternative housing found and time consuming lengthy court cases. In these cases the Contractor has been working closely with Office of the Aging (O of A Coalition Task Force), Adult Protection, The Health Department (Safe Housing Coalition of Central New York) and DSS Emergency Housing.

Re: Bond Resolutions

Please refer to the attached schedule of 23 bond resolutions totaling \$29.5M. Such resolutions are the funding source for capital projects adopted by the full Board of Legislators as part of the 2008 budget.

If all referenced bond resolutions are adopted, general fund net debt will increase to \$114.1M at December 31, 2008. Our balance at December 31, 2007 was \$93.6M. General fund principal pay down will be \$9M in 2008. (Please note that these figures do NOT include the \$13.9M of sewer debt on December 31, 2008).

The estimated average annual debt service for just these new general fund borrowings will be \$2.4M. The net increase to debt service for all general fund debt will be \$1.7M beginning in 2010, assuming no new borrowings in 2009. (Please refer to my Oneida County Debt Analysis Report dated September 4, 2007 which was distributed to all legislators and the County Executive.) In 2008, the general fund will pay \$11.8M toward debt service.

The impact to the tax levy could be less due to potential rental revenue from some properties at Griffiss. However, this revenue estimate has not been provided to me as of this writing.

I respectfully request that these resolutions be acted upon by the full Board of Legislators at their February 27, 2008 meeting.

The Department of Water Quality and Water Pollution Control is in the process of preparing the necessary documents to secure funding for the capital projects listed above.

Article 5-A, Section 268 of the County Law requires, among other things, that a public hearing be held by the Board of Legislators to consider the improvements that will be made by the capital projects in question. This public hearing is required before the Board can consider a bonding resolution for the project. The Board must pass the attached resolution establishing the public hearing to continue the funding process.

I have calculated estimated cost of the project on annual basis for the average Sewer District ratepayer to be \$9.55 for HG406 and \$1.91 for HG407 per year respectively using the conservative assumption that the annual debt service translates directly to the sewer rate. Normally, this is a worst case assumption as debt service is part of the total Department budget and the sewer rate is derived from considering all expenses and revenues that affect the entire budget.

I would appreciate consideration of this request by you and Board of Legislators so that the legislation could be acted during the February 13th meeting. This would allow the public hearing to be held prior to the Board meeting on February 27th. I am available to meet with you or the Board at your convenience to discuss this request and explain the project in more detail.

Honorable Members:

There is a need for additional funds in various salary and related personal services' accounts throughout the County for 2007. These transfer requirements have resulted from a variety of causes. One factor was the settlement of the White Collar labor contract in 2007 which resulted in the payment of an increased level of wages to the employees covered by the agreement. The resulting payroll adjustments, as expected, caused budgetary shortages in many salary accounts, all of which are adequately covered by surpluses in other personal services' accounts and the Special Contingent Account - Salaries, which was funded for just that purpose.

Other significant personal services' shortages occurred in the Sheriff's Jail Inmates' Overtime account which was the result of chronic staffing shortages and also the decision to budget overtime accounts at lower levels in 2007 in an attempt to balance a lean budget.

**RE: LOCAL LAW INTRODUCTORY "B" OF 2008 AMENDING THE ONEIDA COUNTY
ADMINISTRATIVE CODE TO CREATE AN ONEIDA COUNTY COURTHOUSE MAINTENANCE
AND PRESERVATION ADVISORY BOARD**

Legislative Intent: The intent of this local law is to create an advisory board which will render advice and guidance to the Oneida County Executive, the Board of Legislators and the Department of Public works with regard to the maintenance, operations and budget of the Oneida County Courthouses located in Utica and Rome. This advisory board will assist the county in properly maintaining the substantial resources the County has invested in the courthouse facilities, in adequately budgeting for their care, in continuing to find ways to keep the courthouses accessible and user friendly and to preserve the historical status and significance of each facility. It is acknowledged that the County has engaged in a historically significant renovation of each of these facilities and that portraits and other historical artifacts have been contributed to the facilities by the bench and bar of Oneida County.

BE IT ENACTED by the Board of County Legislators of the County of Oneida, State of New York, as follows:

1. That Article VII of the Oneida County Administrative Code is hereby amended by the addition of a Section 710 creating an Oneida County Courthouse Maintenance and Preservation Advisory Board, which section shall read as follows:

Section 710. Oneida County Courthouse Maintenance and Preservation Advisory Board

- a. There shall be an Oneida County Courthouse Maintenance and Preservation Advisory Board which shall render advice and guidance to the Department of Public Works with regard to the maintenance, operation and budget of the Oneida County Courthouses in Utica and the two Oneida County Courthouse locations in Rome. The function of this board shall be advisory only. The advisory board shall be consulted annually by the Commissioner of Public works regarding his or her preparation of the budget for the facility in Utica and both facilities in Rome. The Board shall meet quarterly regarding the status of each structure.
- b. The Advisory Board shall consist of the following members:
 - Two sitting judges, one representing the courthouse facility in Utica and on representing the courthouse facilities in Rome, each to be appointed by the County Executive upon the advice of the Administrative Judge of the district;
 - Two attorneys appointed by the Oneida County Bar Association,
 - The Commissioner of Public Works or his or her designee;
 - The Chair of the Public Works Committee of the Oneida County Board of Legislators or his or her designee.

- c. The Advisory Board shall select a chair annually to convene meetings and to communicate with County government. In addition, the Advisory Board may be convened at the request of the County Executive, the Board of Legislators or the Commissioner of Public Works or any four members of the Advisory Board may agree to hold a special meeting of the Advisory Board with notice of the same to the County Executive, the Clerk of the Oneida County Board of Legislators and other members of the Advisory Board.
- d. The members of this Advisory Board shall receive no salary or compensation for their services but shall, within appropriations provided therefore, be entitled to actual and necessary disbursements and expenses in performing their duties hereunder.

This Local Law shall take effect in accordance with Section 20, 21 and 27 of the Municipal Home Rule Law.



WHEREAS, the County of Oneida, New York has previously adopted bond resolutions dated February 14, 2007 and March 14, 2007 authorizing the construction of a corporate hangar at Griffis Airfield at a maximum estimated cost of \$7,450,000 and the issuance of \$6,450,000 bonds, and the use of \$1,000,000 grants-in-aid to pay the cost thereof; and

WHEREAS, it is now desirable to amend such bond resolutions in order to allocate such funding to various objects and purposes; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the affirmative vote of not less than two-thirds of the total voting strength of the County Legislature of the County of Oneida, New York, as follows:

Section 1. The (i) construction of a new corporate hangar at Griffiss Airfield, including grading or improvement of the site, original furnishings, equipment, machinery and apparatus, in and for said County, is hereby authorized at a maximum estimated cost of \$3,600,000, (ii) construction of new T-hangars, including original furnishings, equipment, machinery, apparatus, appurtenances, and incidental costs incidental thereto, in and for said County, is hereby authorized at a maximum estimated cost of \$2,000,000, (iii) reconstruction of hangar building #220, including original furnishings, equipment, machinery, apparatus, appurtenances, and costs incidental thereto, in and for said County, is hereby authorized at a maximum estimated cost of \$1,600,000, and (iv) construction of a fuel farm, including incidental costs incidental thereto, in and for said County, is hereby authorized at a maximum estimated cost of \$250,000.

Section 2. The plan for the financing of such maximum estimated cost is as follows:

(i) by the issuance of \$6,450,000 bonds of said County hereby authorized to be issued therefor pursuant to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, allocated to the objects or purposes set forth in Section 1; and

(ii) by the application of \$1,000,000 State grants-in-aid, which shall be allocated to the hangar projects.

Section 3. It is hereby determined that the period of probable usefulness of the new hangars is twenty-five years, pursuant to subdivision 17 of paragraph a of Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law; the period of probable usefulness of the reconstruction of hangar #220 is twenty-five years, pursuant to subdivision 12(a)(1) of paragraph a of Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law; and the period of probable usefulness of the fuel farm is ten years, pursuant to subdivision 35 of paragraph a of Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law.

Section 4. The faith and credit of said County of Oneida, New York, are hereby irrevocable pledged for the payment of the principal of and interest on such bonds as the same respectively become due and payable. An annual appropriation shall be made in each year sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such bonds becoming due and payable in such year. To the extent not paid from other sources, there shall annually be levied on all the taxable real property of said County, a tax sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such bonds as the same become due and payable.

Section 5. Subject to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, the power to authorize the issuance of and to sell bond anticipation notes in anticipation of the issuance and sale of the bonds herein authorized, including renewals of such notes, is hereby delegated to the County Comptroller, the chief fiscal officer. Such notes shall be of such terms, form and contents, and shall be sold in such manner, as may be prescribed by said County Comptroller, consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

Section 6. All other matters except as provided herein relating to the serial bonds herein authorized including the date, denominations, maturities and interest payment dates, within the limitations prescribed herein and the manner of execution of the same, including the consolidation with other issues, and also the ability to issue bonds with substantially level or declining annual debt service, shall be determined by the County Comptroller, the chief fiscal officer of such County. Such bonds shall contain substantially the recital of validity clause provided for in Section 52.00 of the Local Finance Law, and shall otherwise be in such form and contain such recitals, in addition to those required by Section 51.00 of the Local Finance Law, as the County Comptroller shall determine consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

Section 7. The validity of such bonds and bond anticipation notes may be contested only if:

- 1) Such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which said County is not authorized to expend money, or

- 2) The provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of publication of this resolution are not substantially complied with,

and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty days after the date of such publication, or

- 3) Such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution.

Section 8. This resolution shall constitute a statement of official intent for purposes of Treasury Regulations Section 1.150-2. Other than as specified in this resolution, no monies are, or are reasonably expected to be, reserved, allocated on a long-term basis, or otherwise set aside with respect to the permanent funding of the object or purpose described herein.

Section 9. This resolution amends in its entirety the February 14, 2007 and March 14, 2007 bond resolutions except with regard to the validity of any obligations previously issued thereunder.

Section 10. This resolution, which takes effect immediately, shall be published in summary form in the *Observer Dispatch* and in the *Rome Sentinel*, the official newspapers of such County, together with a notice of the Clerk of the County Legislature in substantially the form provided in Section 81.00 of the Local Finance Law.

Honorable Members:

It is the recommendation of the New York State Commission of Corrections that Oneida County increase the number in the personnel pool at the Oneida County Jail. This recommendation is the result of an analysis done by the Commission over the last year. The Commission's recommendation is to increase the number of positions in the budget to 213 Correction Officers (Grade 1J, Step 1-\$31,567) from the current number of 194, an increase of 19 Corrections Officers. This increase of personnel was negotiated to be done over the next 3 years with an increase of 6 in 2008, an increase of 7 in 2009 and an increase of 6 in 2010. The Commission also recommended the promotion of an Officer to Correction Officer, Lieutenant (Grade 3J, Step 1-\$39,600) in 2008.

It is the understanding of the Budget Director, the Safety Committee and myself that these additional positions do not increase the minimum staffing levels at the jail. These increases are to increase the pool of people to fill the minimum staffing levels and should result in lowering the overtime according to the Sheriff and the Undersheriff.

In order to comply with the New York State Commission of Corrections recommendations I respectfully request your Board to create six (6) Correction Officers positions in the County Jail cost center A3150. I also ask your Board to fund these positions for the year starting in July 2008.

I therefore request your Board approve the following **2008** fund transfer:


