I enclose herewith a letter from Gregory J. Amoroso, Oneida County's labor counsel, recommending that the above referenced claim against Oneida County be referred to an arbitrator for resolution.

Mr. Amoroso's recommends that the parties select a retired judge to act as an arbitrator and contends that this would be the quickest and least costly way to resolve the matter.

I agree with Mr. Amoroso's recommendation in this matter and I request that the proposal to arbitrate rather than litigate this claim be forwarded to the Board for the approval. The Board's approval is needed because the parties would be bound by the arbitrator's decision.

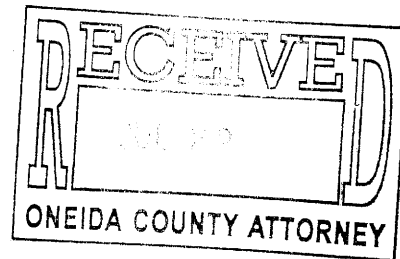

I believe an arbitration would be the quickest and least costly way to resolve this matter.

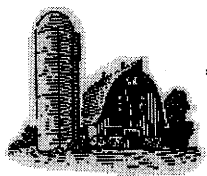

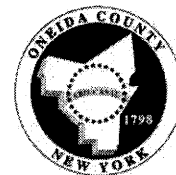

RE: LOCAL LAW PROHIBITING MEMBERS OF THE ONEIDA COUNTY BOARD OF LEGISLATORS FROM ACCEPTING APPOINTED POSITIONS WITH ONEIDA COUNTY FOR A PERIOD OF TWO YEARS FROM THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THE END OF THEIR TERM AS A COUNTY LEGISLATOR

Legislative Intent: The intent of this local law is to prohibit members of the County legislature from accepting appointed positions in County government for a period of two years after the effective date of the end of their term as County legislators. The legitimate interests of the County are served when legislators do not become appointed officials of an administration immediately after serving as legislator.

BE IT ENACTED by the Board of County Legislators of the County of Oneida, State of New York, as follows:

1. The members of the Oneida County Board of Legislators shall be prohibited from applying for or accepting employment as an appointed employee or official of Oneida County for a period of two years following the effective date of the end of such legislator's term of office.
2. This local law shall apply to each member of the legislature regardless of whether such term of office shall be terminated by law, resignation or retirement.
3. This prohibition shall not apply to members of the County Board of Legislators who may qualify at any time for employment with the County under the rules of civil service governing the hiring of County employees.

This Local Law shall take effect in accordance with Section 20, 21 and 27 of the Municipal Home Rule Law.
