WHEREAS, the members of the Oneida County Board of Legislators are gratified that the honorable members of the New York State Senate have seen fit and appropriate to protect law enforcement canines who are injured in the line of duty by passing S4990, which allows paramedics to transport injured canines to the nearest animal hospital or veterinary clinic, so long as all emergency responders have been accounted for; and

WHEREAS law enforcement canines serve a very important role in law enforcement and have ever increasing responsibilities; and

WHEREAS their value is reflected in the penalties for harming law enforcement canines; and

WHEREAS these canines play significant roles in assisting law enforcement personnel in fulfilling their responsibilities from finding drugs and explosives to lost people and more; and

WHEREAS existing legislation precludes paramedics in caring for canine officers injured in the line of duty without facing severe penalties if the human officer is unharmed;

THEREFORE, the members of this Board of Legislators finds it appropriate and reasonable to support both S4990 and (same as) A7668 to enable paramedics to provide the necessary care these law enforcement animals need in the event of a life-threatening injury without legal jeopardy to the paramedics; and

FURTHER, the members of this Board of Legislators respectfully request that the honorable members of the New York State Assembly act to secure passage of A7668 to provide the necessary care to these critical members of law enforcement; and

A MEMORIALIZING PETITION OPPOSING THE EXPANSION OF FEDERAL CONTROL UNDER THE CLEAN WATER ACT

WHEREAS, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the Army Corps of Engineers(Corps) have released the Final Rule for the Definition of Waters of the U.S. under the Clean Water Act; and

WHEREAS, through this rule the agencies have expanded their authority by redefining “navigable waters” under the Clean Water Act beyond what Congress intended and the Supreme Court has reaffirmed; and

WHEREAS, in the Final Rule the EPA and the Corps would subject all tributaries and other features such as ditches, wetlands, ponds, lakes and similar waters with a connection to downstream navigable waters, to the jurisdiction of the Clean Water Act; and

WHEREAS, the Final Rule would cause significant harm to local farmers, stall the development of businesses, take control of land use for sustainable food production out of the our local providers’ hands, and negatively impact County-owned and maintained infrastructure such as roadside ditches and flood control-channels; and

WHEREAS, the cost to our farms, municipalities and tax payers will be enormous; and

WHEREAS, the Oneida County Farm Bureau along with the New York Farm Bureau opposes the Final Rule; and

WHEREAS, it is impractical for the federal government to regulate every tributary, ditch, and pond that may have some tenuous connection, miles away, to a body of water currently defined as “navigable”;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida County Board of Legislators hereby strongly opposes the EPA and Corps expansion of the Clean Water Act; and

A MEMORIALIZING PETITION SUPPORTING SENATOR GILLIBRAND'S AMENDMENT TO THE FEDERAL TRANSPORTATION AUTHORIZATION BILL THAT WOULD GIVE STATES THE AUTHORITY TO USE MORE FEDERAL FUNDS ON LOCAL BRIDGE IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS

WHEREAS, more than one-in-three New York bridges are in need of repair; and

WHEREAS, there are 490 bridges in Oneida County; and

WHEREAS, 71 of the bridges in Oneida County are classified "structurally deficient" meaning they require significant maintenance to remain in service and will eventually require a total rehabilitation. These bridges are often posted with weight limits; and

WHEREAS, 107 of the bridges in Oneida County are classified "functionally obsolete" meaning they cannot handle current traffic demand; and

WHEREAS, 50% of New York's 1,700 bridges are locally owned and federal policy limits the amount of federal transportation funds that states can use to repair those bridges; and

WHEREAS, a program that provided direct funding to states and local governments to invest in bridge construction and repair was eliminated in the 2012 as a part of a larger transportation funding bill; and

WHEREAS, Senator Gillibrand is proposing an amendment that would make federal funds available to repair locally owned bridges through the National Highway Performance Program; and

WHEREAS, Senator Gillibrand's amendment would help to redirect existing dollars to restore bridge funding and ensure local governments the flexibility to determine which projects will receive federal funding; and







Re: Local Law "B" of 2015

Dear Mr. Billard:

In accordance with the provisions of Section 21 of New York State Municipal Home Rule Law, I am returning herewith Local Law "B" of 2015 Regulating the Tethering of Dogs Outdoors.

After considerable review and discussion with various authorities, I conclude that the provision of this law will be extremely difficult to enforce and, most important, this local law will not effectively establish prohibitions which will implement the intent behind this legislation; to wit, dealing with the issue of animal abuse.

The restrictions set forth in this legislation are more narrow than those already established in New York Agriculture and Markets Law Section 353-b and, I believe, more difficult to enforce, requiring the allocation of resources without demonstrable benefits to the public.


In closing, as you know, I stand with you to protect our animal population and to deter animal abuse in our county. I pledge to work with you to achieve these goals. I do not believe this Local Law will accomplish these admirable objectives, and, therefore, cannot endorse it.
