A MEMORIALIZING PETITION URGING CONGRESS TO RECONSIDER THE PLAN TO LEAVE SOCIAL SECURITY RECIPIENTS WITHOUT A COST OF LIVING ADJUSTMENT (COLA) DESPITE MEDICARE PART B PREMIUM INCREASES FOR 2016 AND TO DEVISE A MORE ACCURATE MEANS OF CALCULATING THE ANNUAL COLA BASED UPON TRUE COSTS EXPERIENCED BY SENIORS

WHEREAS, Congress enacted automatic increases for Social Security beneficiaries in 1975 and since that time increases have averaged four (4) percent a year; and

WHEREAS, two-thirds of retirees depend upon Social Security for the majority of their income and only twice before has the COLA remained constant and without an increase; and

WHEREAS, inflation has been so low in 2015, primarily due to lower fuel costs, that there is little chance the Consumer Price Index will yield a benefit increase for 2017; and

WHEREAS, more than 70 million Americans (including 4 million disabled veterans, 2.5 million federal retirees and their survivors and over 8 million SSI recipients) will find themselves without a COLA ; and

WHEREAS, nearly one-third of Medicare beneficiaries will see a significant premium increase, including first-time enrollees, enrollees who do not receive a Social Security benefit, those directly billed for their Part B premium and those who pay a higher premium; and

WHEREAS, New York State will be financially impacted due to the state's premium payments for dual Medicare-Medicaid beneficiaries;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, Oneida County strongly encourages Congress to address the underlying causes of inaccurate COLA calculations which yield fiscal stress to states and their residents and preclude the implementation of the proposed no COLA increase plan; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Oneida County believes our State Representatives must diligently support and convey the necessity of accurate COLA calculations to Congress and the Federal government; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Petition shall be forwarded to the following: NYSAC, New York State Governor Andrew Cuomo, Congressman Richard L. Hanna, United States Senator Charles E. Schumer, United States Senator Kirsten E. Gillibrand, New York State Senator Joseph A. Griffo, New York State Senator David Valesky, New York State Assembly Representative Claudia R. 
- Solid waste/sludge tipping fees will remain the same as 2015 rates, as indicated below:

All other rates remain the same.

- The proposed 2016 tipping fees remain lower than tipping fees in 1992.

- Oneida-Herkimer recyclables will be accepted at no charge for the 25th consecutive year.
- The Authority receives no funding from the Counties. 2016 will mark the 28th consecutive year of a financially self-sufficient and stable operation.
- The proposed budget includes continued revenue from the landfill gas to energy facility at the Regional Landfill and out of County recyclables' processing fees.
- 2016 will mark the 5th year of operation of the Authority's single stream Recycling Center in Utica. The single stream program has increased participation, reduced waste and recovered more material for sale to markets. **Marketed recyclables have increased by 10%. It has also allowed for more efficient collection of recyclables by municipalities and haulers, which means stabilized or lower collection costs.**
- In 2015, the Authority in conjunction with the NYS Environmental Facilities Corporation refinanced the 2006 bonds for the Landfill. This will save the Authority over \$200,000 in 2016.
- In 2016, landfill reserve accounts (established in 2006) will be continued to insure there will not need to be additional future borrowing for the Landfill. In 2016, the Authority plans to use about \$1.1 million for equipment, vehicles and expansion of our gas collection system.
- The Authority will continue to invest in capital assets at its other facilities with approximately \$1.1 million targeted for equipment, vehicles and facility improvements.
- The Authority manages the waste and recyclables collection systems for the City of Utica and the Villages of Ilion, Frankfort, Mohawk, Herkimer and Dolgeville. The Authority currently maintains a separate accounting system for each municipality.

An overview of the proposed 2016 budget is being presented at the November 16, 2015 Board meeting. A public hearing and action by the Board is anticipated for the December 21, 2015 meeting.

In accordance with Section 303-a of the Agriculture and Markets Law, the Oneida County Legislature submitted to me, by Resolution No. 222 of 2015, a district renewal plan with modifications for Oneida County Agricultural District No. 6.

Following review of the plan and its related documentation, I find that the plan is eligible for districting.

In accordance with the statutory procedures for certification of agricultural district review plans, the Commissioner of Environmental Conservation has determined that the District is consistent with State environmental plans, policies and objectives.

In consideration of my review of the plan and the determination of the Commissioner of Environmental Conservation, I hereby certify that:

- B. The District consists predominantly of viable agricultural land.
- C. The plan of the District is feasible.

The County is required to complete the next review of Oneida County Agricultural District No. 6 on or before July 16, 2023.



I recommend that this request be forwarded to the Board of Legislators for their consideration at their next meeting.



The County negotiating team has entered into a Tentative Agreement with the Oneida County Nurses Unit of CSEA in regard to employees serving in full-time and part-time capacities as either Registered Professional Nurse or Public Health Nurse in the Oneida County Department of Health.

The union membership ratified the agreement on October 14, 2015.

In summary, the Tentative Agreement holds as follows:

Length of Contract Two Years (January 1, 2016-December 31, 2017)

Wages: A) For employees on the salary schedule:

2016 0% on schedule
Advance 1 step effective January 1, 2016

2017 2.75% increase to salary schedule effective January 1, 2017
No Step Movement

B) For Employees off the salary schedule

2016 2.75% increase to base salary effective January 1, 2016


2017 2.50% increase to base salary effective January 1, 2017

All Step Movement and Salary increases sunset on December 31, 2017.



All provisions of the January 1, 2014 – December 31, 2015 Labor Agreement will remain in full force and effect unless modified below. All modifications become effective upon ratification unless otherwise noted. This Tentative Agreement is subject to ratification by both the CSEA Membership and by the Oneida County Legislature. The CSEA and the County Negotiating Teams will recommend acceptance of the Tentative Agreement to their respective parties.

WAGES (APPENDIX "A"):

- Each regular full time, part time and per diem Registered Professional Nurse and regular full time, part time and per diem Public Health Nurse "on the schedule" shall advance one step effective January 1, 2016.
- Each regular full time, part time and per diem Registered Professional Nurse and regular full time, part time and per diem Public Health Nurse "off the schedule" shall receive a 2.75% increase in salary effective January 1, 2016.



GRANT OF EASEMENT

COUNTY OF ONEIDA, NEW YORK, a municipal corporation, with its principal address at 800 Park Avenue, Utica, New York 13501, (hereinafter referred to as "Grantor"), for consideration of One Dollar (\$1.00), and other valuable considerations paid, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged under seal, hereby grants to **NIAGARA MOHAWK POWER CORPORATION, a New York corporation, having an address at 300 Erie Boulevard West, Syracuse, New York 13202**, (hereinafter collectively referred to as "Grantee"), for Grantee and its lessees, licensees, successors, and assigns, the perpetual non-exclusive right and easement as described in Section I below (the "Easement") in, under, through, over, across, and upon a portion of Grantor's land, as described in Section 2 below (the "Grantor's Land").

Section 1. Description of the Easement. The "Easement" granted by the Grantor to the Grantee consists of a perpetual easement and right-of-way, with the non-exclusive right, privilege, and authority to:

a. Construct, reconstruct, relocate, extend, repair, maintain, operate, inspect, patrol, and, at its pleasure, abandon or remove underground electric and gas facilities including a line or lines of wires or cables (either direct-buried or installed in underground conduits), handholes, manholes, conduit, vaults, junction boxes, pad-mount transformers, housings, connectors, switches and switching equipment, pipes, pedestals, closures, ducts and duct work, markers, cables, connections to overhead and underground wires, any poles or lines of poles, supporting structures, cables, crossarms, overhead and underground wires, guys, guy stubs, insulators, transformers, braces, fittings, foundations, anchors, lateral service lines, communications facilities, and other fixtures and appurtenances; and underground gas distribution facilities including a line or lines of pipe, valves, fittings, handholes, manholes, conduit, vaults, housings, connectors, pedestals, closures, markers, cables, connections to aboveground facilities, braces, fittings, foundations, anchors, lateral service lines, and other fixtures and appurtenances; (collectively, the "Facilities"), which the Grantee shall require now and from time to time, for the transmission and distribution of high and low voltage electric current, transmission and distribution of natural and manufactured gas, and for the transmission of intelligence and communication purposes, by any means, whether now existing or hereafter devised, for public or private use, in, upon, over, under, and across that portion of the Grantor's Land described in Section 3 below (the "Easement Area"), and the highways abutting or running through the Grantor's Land, and to renew, replace, add to, and otherwise change the Facilities and each and every part thereof and the location thereof within the Easement Area, and utilize the Facilities within the Easement Area for the purpose of providing service to the Grantor and others;

b. From time to time, without further payment therefore, clear and keep cleared, by physical means, the Easement Area of any and all trees, vegetation, roots, aboveground or belowground structures and improvements constructed, placed or installed subsequent to this Grant of Easement, or other natural obstructions and trim and/or remove other trees, roots and vegetation adjacent to the Easement Area that, in the reasonable opinion of the Grantee, may interfere with the construction, operation, and maintenance of the Facilities. The first clearing may be for less than the full width and may be widened from time to time to the full width;

c. Excavate or change the grade of the Grantor's Land as is reasonable, necessary, and proper for any and all purposes described in this Section I; provided, however, that the Grantee will, upon completion of its work, backfill and restore any excavated areas to reasonably the same condition as existed prior to such excavation; and

d. Pass and repass along the Easement Area to and from the adjoining lands and pass and repass over, across, and upon the Grantor's Land to and from the Easement Area, and construct, reconstruct, relocate, use, and maintain such temporary footbridges, causeways, and ways of access, if any, upon the Easement Area, as is reasonable and necessary in order to access the Easement Area, provided that any such temporary footbridge, causeway and/or way of access constructed, reconstructed, located or relocated by the Grantee shall be removed, at Grantor's request, upon conclusion of Grantee's need for access and provided further that Grantee shall return Grantor's land to its condition prior to access by the Grantee.

Section 2. Description of Grantor's Land. The "Grantor's Land" is described in a certain Deed recorded in the Oneida County Clerk's Office on 10/14/1982, in Liber 2132 of Deeds at Page 1109, and consists of land described as being part of Tax Parcel No. 274.000-3-22 of the Town of Whitestown, County of Oneida, State of New York, located on the southerly side of Sutliff Road.

Section 3. Location of the Easement Area. The "Easement Area" shall consist of a portion of the Grantors Land as shown on a survey map entitled "Proposed Utility Easement Through the Lands of The County of Oneida" prepared by Shumaker Consulting Engineering & Land Surveying, D.P.C., dated November 29, 2015, a copy of which is annexed hereto and marked as Exhibit B, and more particularly described in a metes and bounds description attached hereto and marked as Exhibit A.

Section 4. Facilities Ownership. It is agreed that the Facilities shall remain the property of the Grantee, its successors and assigns.

Section 5. General Provisions. The Grantor, for itself, its successors, and assigns, hereby covenants and agrees with the Grantee that no act will be permitted within the Easement Area which is inconsistent with the Easement hereby granted; no buildings or structures, or replacements thereof or additions thereto, swimming pools, or obstructions will be erected or constructed above or below grade within the Easement Area; no trees shall be grown, cultivated, or harvested, and no excavating, mining, or blasting shall be undertaken within the Easement Area without the prior written consent of the Grantee, which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld, conditioned or delayed, it being the intent that the Easement herein conveyed is intended to prohibit the longitudinal or parallel use or occupancy of said




