





Summary Statements:

- 1) **Narrative Description of Proposed Services:** The Oneida County Probation Department provides Initial Response Team (IRT) services to the Rome City School District. It is an early intervention strategy where students just starting to display attendance and behavior problems are involved in a process wherein the Probation Department works with students, parents, school authorities, and service providers to effect positive outcomes and improvement.
- 2) **Program/Service Objectives and Outcomes:** This program is designed to reach 200 students and adjust 80% of those problems without formal Court intervention. In 2015 we worked with 235 cases and diverted 87%.
- 3) **Program Design and Staffing:** Two full-time Probation Officers are employed full-time at Strough Junior High School, RFA, and Madison-Oneida Alternative Education buildings. They also work at selected elementary schools as needed.

Total Funding Requested: \$78,456.19 **Account#:** A3142

Oneida County Dept. Funding Recommendation: \$78,456.19 (Revenue)

Cost Per Client Served: In 2015 the cost per client served totaled \$602.00.

Past Performance Data: We have surpassed our goals of students referred to the program and deferred from Family Court for the past six years.

O.C. Department Staff Comments: Salaries, Fringe Benefits, and Travel are included in our 2016 and 2017 Budgets and we receive further reimbursement from the Oneida County Youth Bureau and the NYS Office of Probation and Correctional Alternatives reducing the County share to \$39,345 in 2016.

The Probation Department recommends that this highly successful and collaborative project continue as it serves Public Safety interests in a cost effective manner and supports the efforts of the Rome City School District and parents to help students make positive changes.


The lease will be funded utilizing our annual budget allocations.

SUMMARY STATEMENTS

1). Narrative Description of Proposed Services

This grant will support the positions of (2) two full-time and (2) part-time Law Enforcement Coordinators from various Police agencies. The Law Enforcement Coordinators (LEC) shall facilitate and assist the Oneida County Child Advocacy Center in their investigation of Multidisciplinary Team (MDT) child abuse cases. The Law Enforcement Coordinators shall be the liaison between Oneida County Child Advocacy Center, the Police Departments, the Department of Social Services and the District Attorney's Office in matters relating to the investigation and prosecution of MDT cases. The LEC shall participate in case review, assist in increasing community awareness of the CAC and be responsible for inputting data regarding the criminal aspect of MDT cases into the computer program. The Grant will also support part of the Child Advocacy Administrator.

The main objective for the program and what makes the Oneida County Child Advocacy Center an asset to the County is that all facets are located under one roof, which is a child-friendly site where children and their families receive coordinated services. The Center is home to the multidisciplinary team which provides on-site law enforcement, Oneida County DSS Caseworkers, victim advocacy, scheduled medical examinations, counseling, preventive support, child fatality review and a state of the art training facility.
