HISTORY OF THE ONEIDA COUNTY YOUTH BUREAU

The Youth Bureau was created in 1977 by the Oneida County Board of Legislators. For 38 years it has carried out its mission of planning, advocating and coordinating services for children and youth under the age of 21.

State aid is allocated to programs on a yearly basis via RFP (request for proposal) process which the youth bureau oversees.

The Youth Bureau allocates these funds on a yearly basis to programs that provide youth services such as youth development, RHY (runaway and homeless youth) and early childhood intervention.

We will continue to nurture our current relationships and work tirelessly to develop new ones. We will fulfill County Executive Picente mission of bringing agencies, municipalities, school districts and merchants together to deliver the best possible and most cost effective programs above and beyond what has been and is currently being offered to all youth in Oneida County.

ADVISORY BOARD

Our Youth Advisory Board is comprised of volunteer community leaders who serve to advise the youth bureau and the agencies it supports.

Board members dedicate many hours of work on a volunteer basis and are an invaluable resource to the staff. Board members are appointed by the County Executive and Youth Bureau Director. They serve a two year term.

ANNUAL INITIATIVES

INTER-GENERATIONAL CLEAN UP SPRING (APRIL) / FALL (OCTOBER)

Youth volunteers from Oneida County school districts, colleges and youth organizations provide general yard clean up services for senior citizens who physically can't do the work or financially afford to have the work done.

STOP-DWI HIGH SCHOOL BASEBALL CLASSIC (MAY)

This educational event is held just before the prom, ball and graduation season. Ten Oneida County varsity baseball teams will play in the event that is free of charge to the public. Presentations are given throughout the event.

The mission of the classic is to make our youth and their families aware of the terrible consequences that result when people make destructive decisions.

SIDEWALK ART CONTEST (JULY)

This fun filled event is open to all Oneida County youth ages 5 through 18. Contest rules are simple; draw a positive image on a single sidewalk slab with sidewalk chalk.

There are individual contests and finals where each age group has an opportunity to win. Medals are awarded to the top 3 artists of each age group.

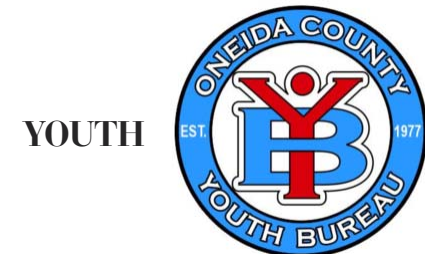
YOUTH FUN & FITNESS RUN (AUGUST)
