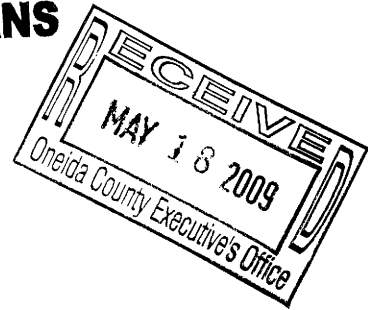

Dear Chairman Fiorini:

I am requesting the Oneida County Board of Legislators approval for the addition of two (2) positions to A1411 County Clerk – Motor Vehicle Bureau. The positions requested are classified as Motor Vehicle Representative, at a grade W14 step 1, with a salary of \$19,881.

The Department of Motor Vehicles has seen and will continue to see a large influx in license transactions as the federal government's WHTI program commences on June 1, 2009. For many years, Canadians and U.S. citizens have been exempt from presenting a passport or other secure document to enter the United States. Under the Western Hemisphere Travel Initiative (WHTI), the number of documents U.S. citizens can present when returning to the United States from Canada, Mexico, Bermuda or the Caribbean will be limited to a handful of Department of Homeland Security approved, highly secure identification cards. The Department of Motor Vehicles Enhanced Driver License (EDL) meets this requirement.

Application time to obtain the EDL is between 20 to 30 minutes per license. The applicant must provide proof of citizenship, identity, New York State residency and social security card. The applicant will receive their license in the mail in approximately 2 to 3 weeks. An EDL costs \$30 in addition to any fees required for a drivers license and is valid for 8 years, in comparison to a U.S. passport that costs more than \$100.


The Oneida County Department of Motor Vehicles retains \$9.00 for every EDL transaction. Since January 2009 the Department of Motor Vehicles has processed 930 EDL applications (405 EDLs at the Rome DMV & 469 EDLs at the Utica DMV).

The EDL is only one aspect of the responsibilities of the Motor Vehicle Representative position. As you know the Oneida County Department of Motor Vehicles also issues operator's licenses, vehicle registrations, renewals, permit testing and enforcement (DWI, DWAI, suspensions, revocations, reinstatements), DDP class scheduling, etc. The Motor Vehicle Representative is responsible for reviewing and processing registration and licensing documents and receiving appropriate fees. During the month of April 2009 the Oneida County Department of Motor Vehicles processed 18,268 transactions (7,965 at Rome DMV & 10,303 at Utica DMV), excluding EDL transactions.

With the number of transactions conducted monthly and the 20 to 30 minute process time for an EDL, the lines at the Utica & Rome DMV have become longer, the customer wait time has increased. The Oneida County Department of Motor Vehicles strives to provide better customer service to the Oneida County taxpayers, but without sufficient staffing this is being hindered.


The Oneida County Department of Motor Vehicles generates revenue toward the General Fund by a prescribed percentage of the transactions conducted. The Department of Motor Vehicles anticipates generating \$208,399 in revenue in 2009 towards the General Fund.

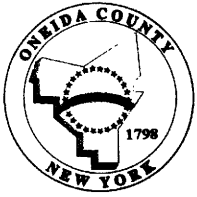

PURPOSE OR GENERAL IDEA OF BILL:

To authorize Oneida County to impose an additional one percent rate of sales and compensating use taxes for the period beginning December 1, 2009, and ending November 30, 2011, and also to impose a second additional sales and compensating use tax rate of either three quarters of one percent or one-half of one percent for the same period. The bill also provides for distribution of a portion of the net collections from the additional one percent rate.

SUMMARY OF SPECIFIC PROVISIONS:

The county currently imposes an additional one percent rate and an additional three-quarters of one percent rate, for a total current rate of four and three-quarters percent effective through November 30, 2009. Bill section 2 would amend Tax Law section 1262-g to continue the county's current allocation and distribution scheme for a portion of the net collections from the additional one percent rate through August 31, 2011.

Bill section 3 provides that the bill would take effect immediately.



This Office is requesting that Oneida County enter into contract again with the New York State Office of Homeland Security for the 2008 State Law Enforcement Terrorism Prevention Program. We have been awarded \$99,750 and the grant will expire on August 31, 2011.

The monies obtained for the grant will be dual purpose. First, the grant will allow us to continue the Automatic Vehicle Locator (AVL) Project once the existing grant has expired. This is presently funded under Capitol Project #419. This project pays for a cellular based system that helps to coordinate manpower and vehicle resources in critical incidents. It is important for Officer Safety. The system is in place but there are operating costs involved. This project is coordinated with Village and Town police agencies, as well as the City of Rome.

Secondly, the grant will allow the Sheriff's Office to purchase a Special Mission Vehicle to assist in Emergency Response Team Deployment. This vehicle will be a specially equipped emergency response vehicle for critical incidents such as a barricaded subject, a high risk warrant service, or a weapons of mass destruction (WMD) deployment. Mobilization of staff and equipment to respond to at risk incidents is vital.

I am asking that the Board approval process be expedited due to time constraints. I also request that a new Capitol Project be established when the funds are available because this is a multi year project and for tracking the expenses separately.



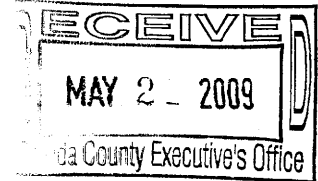
