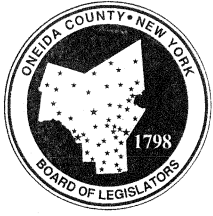

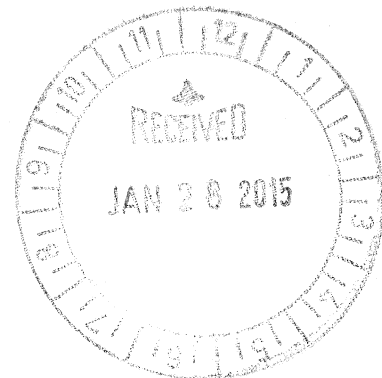

I am submitting the following Purchase of Services Agreement for review and approval by the Board of Legislators per Board Resolutions and Local Law #3 of 2001, amending Article VIII, Section 802 of the Administrative Code.

The Purchase of Services Agreement with the Utica Police Department provides one full-time Law Enforcement Coordinator specially trained in Child Advocacy Center's protocols and procedures regarding child abuse cases. The Law Enforcement Coordinators will be assigned to the Center and act as the liaison between the Child Advocacy Center and their respective agency.

The Child Advocacy Center has been in effect since 1990. The Center is comprised of a multidisciplinary team that includes Law Enforcement, Child Protective Services, medical providers, advocacy and counseling.

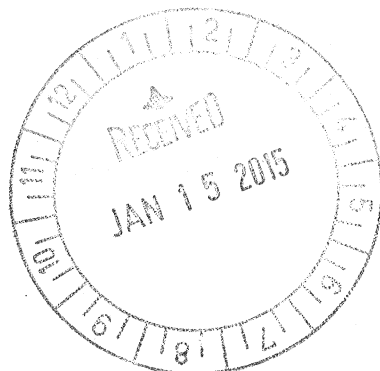
This Agreement is scheduled to become effective January 1, 2015 through December 31, 2015. The total cost is \$ 112,442.50, with a local share of 50% or \$ 56,221.25.

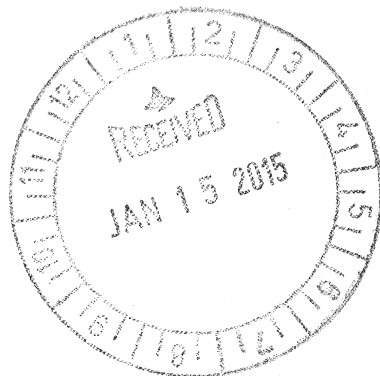

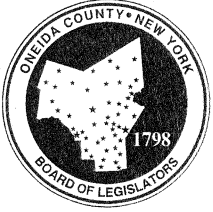

Mr. Chairman:

The City of Rome, Common Council passed Local Law A(1) on June 25, 2014 changing the council district boundaries of the City of Rome. This was based on population data adjusted by the New York State Legislative Task Force on Demographic Research and Reapportionment from the 2010 U.S. census.

Pursuant to the redistricting, some of the city of Rome election districts will be renumbered as a result. The numbering of the districts changed, however the modifications in Rome did not alter the physical boundaries of the election districts or legislative districts. The physical area of each and every district remains the same, just the numbering within some of the existing legislative districts is different. Maps of the affected legislative districts will be produced that reflect the newly designated election district numbers, but conflict with the original maps produced pursuant to the redistricting of Oneida County legislative districts and the local law passed creating them .

Therefore, Oneida County Local Law 5 of 2013 must be amended so that the change of the Rome city election district numbers, the revised maps and the local law reflect the same information.

This letter is regarding the most recent Consolidated Funding Application (CFA) Grant (CFA 40213 NUAIR) of \$4 million that was originally awarded to the Northeast UAS Airspace Integration Research Alliance (NUAIR).

The CFA Grant has subsequently been assigned to Oneida County from NUAIR for the purposes of Grant execution. Acceptance of the grant assignment requires the Oneida County Board of Legislatures allow the sole source purchase of the LSTAR and WAM Radar systems for the purposes of grant execution. The two Radar systems are certified by the DoD and FAA respectively.

The original CFA grant application submitted by NUAIR identified Saab Sensis and SRC as the sole source companies for the purchase, installation and maintenance of the Phase I Griffiss UAS Test Site Radar Instrumentation System.

Upon completion of Phase I of the range instrumentation, Phase II will be advertised under a competitive bid.

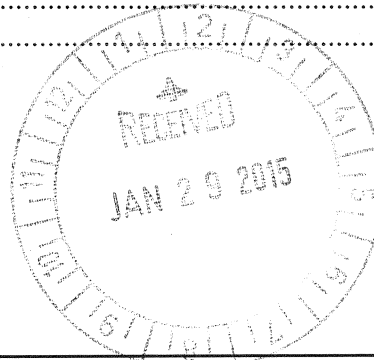
Honorable Members:

# Equitable Sharing Agreement

**1. Submission.** This Document must be submitted to [aca.submit@usdoj.gov](mailto:aca.submit@usdoj.gov) within 60 days of the end of the Agency's fiscal year. This Document must be submitted electronically with the Affidavit/Signature submitted by fax. This will constitute submission to the Department of Justice and the Department of the Treasury.

**2. Signatories.** This agreement must be signed by the head of the Agency and the head of the governing body. Examples of Agency heads include police chief, sheriff, director, commissioner, superintendent, administrator, chairperson, secretary, city attorney, county attorney, district attorney, prosecuting attorney, state attorney, commonwealth attorney, and attorney general. The governing body's head is the person who allocates funds or approves the budget for the Agency. Examples of governing body heads include city manager, mayor, city council chairperson, county executive, county council chairperson, director, secretary, administrator, commissioner, and governor.

**3. Uses.** Any shared asset shall be used for law enforcement purposes in accordance with the statutes and guidelines that govern the federal Equitable Sharing Program as set forth in the current edition of the Department of Justice's *Guide to Equitable Sharing for State and Local Law Enforcement (Justice Guide)*, and the Department of the Treasury's *Guide to Equitable Sharing for Foreign Countries and Federal, State, and Local Law Enforcement Agencies (Treasury Guide)*.

**4. Transfers.** Before the Agency transfers cash, property, or proceeds to other state or local law enforcement agencies, it must first verify with the Department of Justice or the Department of the Treasury, depending on the source of the funds, that the receiving agency is a current and compliant Equitable Sharing Program participant.

**5. Internal Controls.** The Agency agrees to account separately for federal equitable sharing funds received from the Department of Justice and the Department of the Treasury. Funds from state and local forfeitures and other sources must not be commingled with federal equitable sharing funds. The Agency shall establish a separate revenue account or accounting code for state, local, Department of Justice, and Department of the Treasury forfeiture funds. Interest income generated must be accounted for in the appropriate federal equitable sharing account.

The Agency agrees that such accounting will be subject to the standard accounting requirements and practices employed for other public funds as supplemented by requirements set forth in the current edition of the *Justice Guide* and the *Treasury Guide*, including the requirement in the *Justice Guide* to maintain relevant documents and records for five years.

The misuse or misapplication of shared resources or the supplantation of existing resources with shared assets is prohibited. Failure to comply with any provision of this agreement shall subject the recipient agency to the sanctions stipulated in the current edition of the *Justice or Treasury Guides*, depending on the source of the funds/property.

**6. Audit Report.** Audits will be conducted as provided by the Single Audit Act Amendments of 1996 and OMB Circular A-133. The Department of Justice and Department of the Treasury reserve the right to conduct periodic random audits.

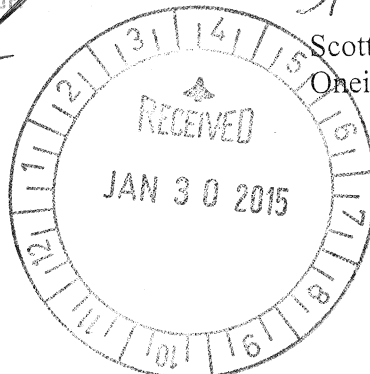

# Equitable Sharing Agreement

This Federal Equitable Sharing Agreement, entered into among (1) the Federal Government, (2) the above-stated law enforcement agency ("Agency"), and (3) the governing body, sets forth the requirements for participation in the federal Equitable Sharing Program and the restrictions upon the use of federally forfeited cash, property, proceeds, and any interest earned thereon, which are equitably shared with participating law enforcement agencies. By its signatures, the Agency agrees that it will be bound by the statutes and guidelines that regulate shared assets and the following requirements for participation in the federal Equitable Sharing Program. Receipt of the signed Equitable Sharing Agreement and Certification (this "Document") is a prerequisite to receiving any equitably shared cash, property, or proceeds.

**1. Submission.** This Document must be submitted to [aca.submit@usdoj.gov](mailto:aca.submit@usdoj.gov) within 60 days of the end of the Agency's fiscal year. This Document must be submitted electronically with the Affidavit/Signature submitted by fax. This will constitute submission to the Department of Justice and the Department of the Treasury.

**2. Signatories.** This agreement must be signed by the head of the Agency and the head of the governing body. Examples of Agency heads include police chief, sheriff, director, commissioner, superintendent, administrator, chairperson, secretary, city attorney, county attorney, district attorney, prosecuting attorney, state attorney, commonwealth attorney, and attorney general. The governing body's head is the person who allocates funds or approves the budget for the Agency. Examples of governing body heads include city manager, mayor, city council chairperson, county executive, county council chairperson, director, secretary, administrator, commissioner, and governor.

**3. Uses.** Any shared asset shall be used for law enforcement purposes in accordance with the statutes and guidelines that govern the federal Equitable Sharing Program as set forth in the current edition of the Department of Justice's *Guide to Equitable Sharing for State and Local Law Enforcement (Justice Guide)*, and the Department of the Treasury's *Guide to Equitable Sharing for Foreign Countries and Federal, State, and Local Law Enforcement Agencies (Treasury Guide)*.

**4. Transfers.** Before the Agency transfers cash, property, or proceeds to other state or local law enforcement agencies, it must first verify with the Department of Justice or the Department of the Treasury, depending on the source of the funds, that the receiving agency is a current and compliant Equitable Sharing Program participant.

**5. Internal Controls.** The Agency agrees to account separately for federal equitable sharing funds received from the Department of Justice and the Department of the Treasury. Funds from state and local forfeitures and other sources must not be commingled with federal equitable sharing funds. The Agency shall establish a separate revenue account or accounting code for state, local, Department of Justice, and Department of the Treasury forfeiture funds. Interest income generated must be accounted for in the appropriate federal equitable sharing account.

The Agency agrees that such accounting will be subject to the standard accounting requirements and practices employed for other public funds as supplemented by requirements set forth in the current edition of the *Justice Guide* and the *Treasury Guide*, including the requirement in the *Justice Guide* to maintain relevant documents and records for five years.

The misuse or misapplication of shared resources or the supplantation of existing resources with shared assets is prohibited. Failure to comply with any provision of this agreement shall subject the recipient agency to the sanctions stipulated in the current edition of the *Justice or Treasury Guides*, depending on the source of the funds/property.

**6. Audit Report.** Audits will be conducted as provided by the Single Audit Act Amendments of 1996 and OMB Circular A-133. The Department of Justice and Department of the Treasury reserve the right to conduct periodic random audits.
