PUBLIC WORKS

Dear County Executive Picente:

Oneida County received a New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC) Climate Smart Communities Grant award under the 2016 Consolidated Funding Application (CFA) program to cover a portion of the cost of constructing an Organics Processing Facility at the Oneida-Herkimer Solid Waste Authority Recycling Center/Transfer Station. The amount of the grant is \$1,327,500 which is 50% of the projected cost of \$2,655,000.

Under this grant, the Solid Waste Authority (Authority) would construct a processing facility for commercial and institutional source separated food waste at their recycling center/transfer station. Once processed into a slurry, this material will be pumped to the Oneida County Water Pollution Control Plant for processing through the new anaerobic digester complex currently being constructed. This material will be mixed with the sludge that will be processed by the facility, enhancing its digestibility and ability to produce methane gas. The methane gas will be burned in micro turbines to produce electricity for use within the plant.

It should be noted that the Authority will be responsible for the entire project, at no cost to Oneida County. They will own the equipment when the project is done and be responsible for its operation and maintenance. The County partnered with the Authority on this project as only New York State municipalities were eligible for grant monies under this program. Proceeds received from the grant will be passed through to the Solid Waste Authority for use in completing the project.

The partnership that the County has developed with the Solid Waste Authority as reflected in this grant is beneficial to both parties. The Authority will have a facility that will help them comply with future New York State Solid Waste Regulations which will prohibit the disposal of large volumes of institutional organic waste into landfills. The project also project also avoids fuel consumption related to transferring waste to landfills and promotes the conservation of landfill space. The Department benefits by receiving a material that it can receive a disposal fee for that also enhances the digestibility of the normal feedstock to the anaerobic digester complex.

From an environmental perspective, the project will limit energy production from virgin materials and improve air quality due to the recovery of energy and reduction of greenhouse gas emissions. The project is also consistent with the New York State Solid Waste Management Plan, Beyond Waste, which identifies anaerobic digestion as an available technology for organics management with the added benefit of more efficient biogas production than landfills and the greater potential for energy recovery. The project is also consistent with the Mohawk Valley Regional Sustainability Plan.

The NYSDEC, who will be administering the grant on behalf of New York State, has also strongly suggested that Oneida County, as recipient of the grant, adopt a resolution embracing the ten (10) elements of the Climate Smart Communities Pledge. If you look at the elements of the pledge, our community is already embracing most of them. I have attached some information that explains the pledge and a model resolution that the NYSDEC suggests be used as a basis of developing a local resolution.

In order for the grant process to move forward, the Oneida County Board of Legislators must accept the grant and designate you as the person that has permission to execute any documents necessary to receive and administer the grant. It would also be beneficial to the project if the Board would adopt the Climate Smart Communities Pledge resolution as discussed above.

I respectfully request that you and the Board of Legislators act on this matter at you earliest possible convenience.



In a continuing effort to assist Oneida County residents, we are proposing to apply for Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funding available through the New York State Office of Community Renewal (OCR) 2017 Competitive Round for Housing Activities.

Based on requirements from the OCR and The HomeOwnership Center's success with several existing programs in the County, we intend to apply for \$600,000 from the OCR to continue a Housing Rehabilitation/Manufactured Home Replacement Program. The proposed project for this year will provide housing rehabilitation/manufactured home replacement services for five (5) low income, frail elderly and/or disabled households of Oneida County.

Based on requirements from the OCR and The HomeOwnership Center's success with several existing programs in the County, we intend to apply for \$250,000 from the OCR to establish an Oneida County Well and Septic Program. The proposed program will assist low and moderate income existing homeowners with repairing/replacing their individual well and septic systems. A total of thirteen (13) households will receive assistance through a five-year forgivable loan program.

Since the OCR program does not require a local match, no Oneida County dollars will be expended on these projects. Upon award of the OCR grant, The HomeOwnership Center will administer the Community Development Block Grant program on behalf of Oneida County.


