Dear Mr. Picente:

We are writing to you today to advise you that we need to enter into a continued warranty and software agreement that Oneida County has with Dominion Voting Systems Corporation. Dominion was recently awarded a new contract on June 15, 2021, under award number 23198 and Contract Number 69385 as the approved vendor for warranty services for the Voting Machines and Software that the Board of Elections uses. Our current agreement with Dominion is set to expire on August 31, 2021. Enclosed please find a Warranty Agreement, the State Contract documentation and a quote that we have received from Dominion Voting Systems Corporation for the continuation of the warranty for our EMS System, voting machines and scanners. The term is for five years beginning September 1, 2021, with an annual payment of \$53,507.80 for a total of \$267,539.00. There is an option to renew for one additional year.

The current warranty will expire on August 31, 2021. Therefore, **time is of the essence** and we respectfully request that if the enclosed meets with your approval, this matter be forwarded to the Oneida County Board of Legislators for consideration at its August 11, 2021 meeting.

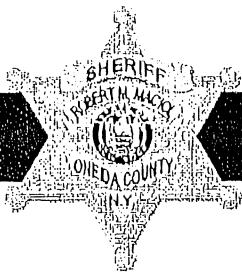

Dear County Executive Picente:

The Sheriff's Office is requesting approval of an agreement with the New York Mills Union Free School District to enable the school to take advantage of Verra Mobility's school bus violation monitoring system and place cameras on their school busses.

This agreement will run for four (4) years, beginning upon the date of execution. There is no cost to the County. The goal of this program is to increase the safety of children onboarding or exiting stopped school busses, and to hold violators accountable when they pass school busses with the stop arm extended. This program will automatically take photos of violators, these violations will be reviewed by the Sheriff's Office, and tickets with fines will be sent to the violators.

If this agreement meets your approval, I request that you forward same to the Board of Legislators for approval at their next meeting. I ask that this agreement with New York Mills become a template for all school districts that wish to take advantage of this school bus photo violation monitoring system.

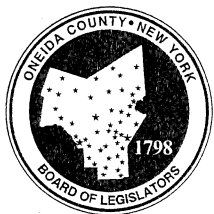
