Dear County Executive Picente:

I am respectfully requesting the Board of Legislators consideration and approval of an increase in the expenses necessary to collect the mortgage tax receipts, this is based on Section 262 of the Tax Law. As provided in Tax Law Section 262, the requested reimbursement must be approved by the tax commission and accompanied by a resolution approved and passed by the Board before April 1, 2021. This process was developed to make yearly increases based on the rate of inflation rather than make larger increases at longer intervals. The expenses the Clerk's Office incurs went up this year and the current rate does not adequately reimburse the Clerk's Office for the cost of collecting this tax.

The Clerk's Office is requesting that we be allowed to charge the State of New York the actual cost of annually collecting the mortgage tax proceeds. We are requesting that the current charge be raised based on the yearly cost incurred by the County to \$507,234.41. As stated above, this increase requires Board action and must be to the STATE OF NEW YORK BY APRIL 1, 2021 in order to take effect.

Attached for your review and approval is a request from Daniel W. Gilmore, Oneida County Public Health Director requesting the salary reallocation of the title of Environmental Health Director to the Oneida County Allocation Plan.

The title of Environmental Health Director has not been reallocated since prior to 2000 and has had significant changes to the duties as well as the role of the Environmental Health Director. The Environmental Health program is the largest and most complex program within the Health Department with an approximate \$2.25 million budget managed by the Environmental Health Director. The Director is also responsible for supervising 20 Oneida County employees, oversees 7 Oneida County Public Health Programs as well as supervising staff who regulate approximately 2,500 facilities. The Environmental Health Director acts on behalf of the Public Health Director as necessary.

Upon review of this information, I request that the Salary Allocation for the title of Environmental Health Director be reallocated from 38M to 46M.

# **ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH DIRECTOR**

<u>DISTINGUISHING FEATURES OF THE CLASS:</u> The incumbent in this class is responsible for supervising, directing, planning and administering the work of an environmental unit in applying the principles needed for managing the environmental factors that influence health. The incumbent's responsibilities also include directing Department policy, with regard to Environmental Division activities. The work is performed under the general supervision of the Director of Public Health, in accordance with established policies and procedures. Supervision is exercised over Environmental Division staff. The incumbent performs related work as required.

# TYPICAL WORK ACTIVITIES: (Illustrative Only)

Assists the Public Health Director and Deputy Public Health Director in planning, organizing and directing a local public health program, including the identification, influence and treatment of disease and disease trends throughout the County;

Acts on behalf of the Public Health Director and Deputy Public Health Director in their absence and assumes all administrative, operating and reporting functions normally performed by the Public Health Director and Deputy Public Health Director as necessary;

Directs environmental health programs concerned with the education and inspection of food service establishments, private and public water supplies, private sewage disposal, housing hygiene/property maintenance, bathing beaches and swimming pools, children's camps, campgrounds, mobile home parks and temporary residence to ensure compliance with State and local Sanitary Codes;

Directs the review of plans for realty subdivisions;

Directs the investigation of residences and the dissemination of health education pertaining to childhood lead poisoning prevention;

Directs the conduct of Environmental Health assessments:

Directs the conduct of pollution studies and soil percolation tests;

Directs investigations of facility operators and prepares reports, recommendations and deficiencies;

Prepares and manages Environmental Health program budget;

Testifies at code enforcement hearings;

Serves as consultant to local jurisdictions involving discussions, instructions and demonstrations:

Proposes local regulations to provide conformity with the State Sanitary Codes and confers with local officials regarding their impact;

Arranges inspection schedules and distributes work assignments to Environmental staff; Oversees training and supervision of Environmental staff;

Reviews inspection activities and reports for problems, deficiencies and completeness;

Conducts office and field conferences concerning environmental problems and issues;

Conducts code enforcement pre-hearing proceedings.

<u>CHARACTERISTICS</u>: Comprehensive knowledge of environmental health principles, sanitation laws, regulations and modern inspection methods; ability to inspect for, and detect, evaluate and abate environmental health problems and hazards; ability to develop and maintain good public relations; ability to secure the interest and cooperation of public officials, civic groups and the general public in environmental sanitation inspection activities; ability to plan and supervise the work of staff; ability to communicate effectively both orally and in writing; good professional judgment.

# **MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:** Either:

- (A) Graduation from a regionally accredited or New York State registered four (4) year college or university with a Bachelor's Degree in sanitary, environmental, chemical, civil or public health engineering or a related engineering field; **AND** five (5) years of full time administrative or supervisory experience in the field of environmental health that demonstrate that the candidate has the technical and administrative skills necessary to manage programs that can anticipate, recognize and respond to environmental health challenges; **OR**
- (B) Graduation from a regionally accredited or New York State registered four (4) year college or university with a Bachelor's Degree including 30 credit hours in the natural sciences\*, of which not more than 12 credit hours may be in the applied sciences\*\*, AND five (5) years of full time administrative or supervisory experience in the field of environmental health that demonstrate that the candidate has the technical and administrative skills necessary to manage programs that can anticipate, recognize and respond to environmental health challenges.

\*The term natural science shall mean a science such as biology, chemistry or physics that deals with the objects, phenomena, or laws of nature and the physical world. It shall include all physical and biological sciences.

\*\*The term applied science shall mean science based courses in environmental technology, sanitation technology, medical technology, public health, infection control or food science.

# NOTES:

- A Master's Degree in public or environmental health or a related field that demonstrates the five core competencies of a public health education (Biostatistics, Environmental Health Services, Epidemiology, Health Policy and Management and Social and Behavior Sciences) will be accepted in lieu of one (1) year of required experience.
- 2. A Doctoral Degree in in public or environmental health or a related field that demonstrates the five core competencies of a public health education (Biostatistics, Environmental Health Services, Epidemiology, Health Policy and Management and Social and Behavior Sciences) will be accepted in lieu of two (2) years of required experience.
