WHEREAS, the COMMISSIONER and the MUNICIPALITY have entered into an Agreement No. <u>D089876</u> entitled Snow and Ice Agreement between the New York State Department of Transportation and the Municipality of <u>County of Oneida</u> dated <u>March 10, 1975</u>; and

WHEREAS, the term of the said Agreement is for a period of three years commencing July 1, **1974** and the said Agreement provides that the parties may at the end of each year of the term of the Agreement extend such term for an additional year; and

WHEREAS, the present term of the Agreement, as extended, expires June 30, 2018; and

WHEREAS, Section 7 of the said Agreement provides that the COMMISSIONER shall furnish the MUNICIPALITY with a suitable map for each term of the Agreement, or for any extended term thereof, modified to show the changes, if any, to the State Highways affected by this Agreement.

WHEREAS, Section 10 of the said Agreement provides for an annual update of the estimated expenditure to be determined by the COMMISSIONER subject to the provisions of Section 10 at the time for extension of the Agreement;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and benefits between the parties,

## WITNESSETH:

- 1. The aforementioned Snow and Ice Agreement between New York State Department of Transportation and the MUNICIPALITY" is hereby extended for a period of one year; now to expire on June 30, <u>2019</u>, unless further extended.
- 2. The State Highways or parts thereof affected by this Agreement are as delineated on the attached map, agreed upon by the COMMISSIONER and the MUNICIPALITY, which shall be effective for the remainder of the term of the Agreement commencing July 1, 2018, unless changed by future agreement between the COMMISSIONER and the MUNICIPALITY.
- 3. All the terms and conditions of the original contract remain in effect except as follows. The estimated expenditure specified in Section 10 of the aforementioned Agreement shall be \$2,441,027.00 for 370.41 lane miles for the 2016/17 season and for the remainder of the term of the Agreement commencing July 1, 2016, unless changed by future update.

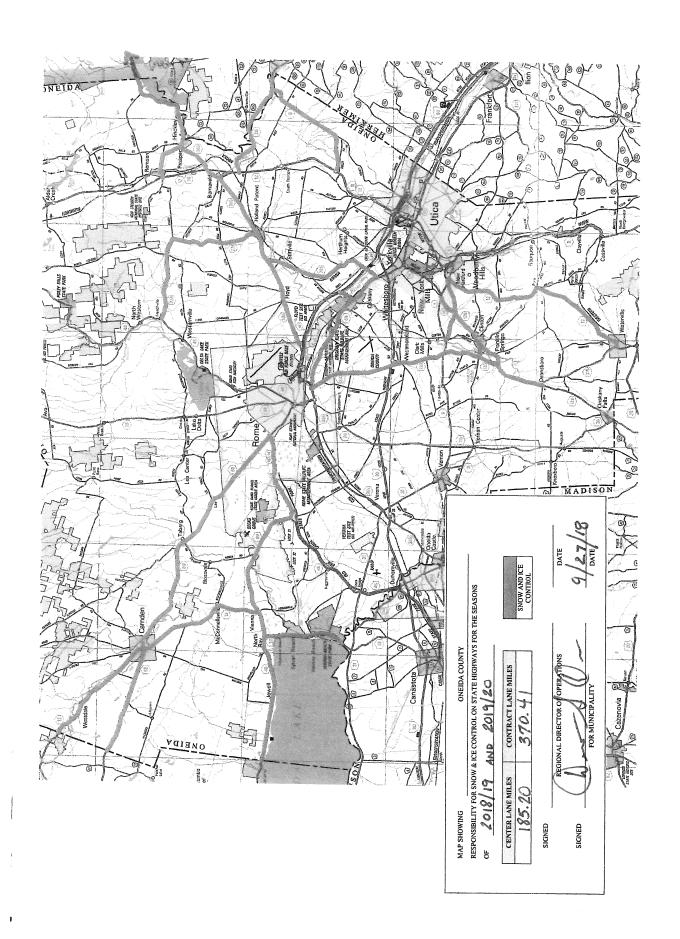

Dear Honorable Members:

Oneida County has commenced legal action against various pharmaceutical companies to recover costs incurred by the County related to the necessary response to the Opioid addiction problem in our County. This epidemic has caused almost every Oneida County Department to incur costs. The County must identify and quantify these costs. Hundreds of boxes of documents need to be scanned in a very small window of time. The cost for this scanning was not budgeted in the 2018 budget.

It is believed the County has a very strong case and it is expected the County will receive compensation. In order to account for all of the expenses being incurred for the lawsuit I would like to set up a separate account to track these expenses and record some of the expected revenue. In order to achieve this in the budget it is necessary to do a supplemental appropriation:

- 3) Such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution.

## **AGREEMENT**

THIS AGREEMENT (the "Agreement"), is made this \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_,2018, by and between the Oneida County Self-Insurance Plan, a county self-insurance plan duly created by Article V of the New York State Workers' Compensation Law, with its principal offices located at 800 Park Avenue, Utica, New York 13501, hereinafter referred to as the "County," and the Town of Westmoreland, a municipal corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of New York, having its principal office located at 100 Station Road, Westmoreland, New York, hereinafter referred to as the "Town," each a "Party," and collectively the "Parties."

## **WITNESSETH**

WHEREAS, the Town has previously elected to withdraw from the County's Self-Insurance Plan (the "Plan") effective January 1, 2015, and has expressed a willingness to assume all responsibility for its claims existing as of that date, and all future claims accruing after the date of the Town's withdrawal from the Plan; and

WHEREAS, the County has agreed to allow the Town to withdraw from the Plan providing certain assurances are made and agreed to; and

WHEREAS, the Parties wish to memorialize the terms and conditions concerning the Town's withdrawal from the Plan;

NOW, in consideration of the mutual promises herein contained, the Parties agree as follows:

1. The Town will assume full responsibility for all of its workers' compensation claims existing as of January 1, 2015, and from that time forward. The Town will be responsible for all costs, fees, payments, charges, penalties and any other expenses whatsoever concerning any and all workers'

compensation claims pending as of January 1, 2015, and continuing up through the date of execution of this Agreement, and all times after.

- 2. The Town shall take any and all steps necessary to assume administrative control of its workers' compensation claims, including acquiring its own "W" number from the New York State Workers' Compensation Board, or, alternatively, arranging for a third party administrator hired by the Town to assume administration of the claims.
- 3. Except as provided in paragraphs 4 and 5, below, the Parties agree that no payments will be required to be made either from the Town to the County or from the County to the Town with respect to the Town's withdrawal from the Plan, and that neither the Town nor the County shall be under any current or future obligations to make any such payments.
- 4. To the fullest extent permitted by applicable law, the Town (the "Indemnifying Party") shall indemnify and hold harmless, and at the County's option, defend, the County, and/or its officers, directors, members, agents, employees, contractors and other representatives (each, individually, an "Indemnified Party" and, collectively, the "Indemnified Parties"), from and against any and all liabilities, damages, losses, costs, expenses (including, without limitation, any and all reasonable attorneys' fees and disbursements), causes of action, suits, liens, claims, damages, penalties, obligations, demands or judgments of any nature, including, without limitation, for death, personal injury and property damage, economic damage, and claims brought by third parties for personal injury and/or property damage (collectively, "Damages"), incurred by any Indemnified Party caused by any negligent act or omission, or intentional misconduct of the Indemnifying Party, its officers, agents, employees (including the Town's authorized personnel) arising out of or in connection with this Agreement, except to the extent such Damages are caused by the sole negligence, unlawful act or omission, or intentional misconduct of an Indemnified Party.
- 5. To the fullest extent permitted by applicable law, the County (the "Indemnifying Party") shall indemnify and hold harmless, and at the Town's option, defend, the Town, and/or its officers, directors, members, agents, employees, contractors and other representatives (each, individually, an "Indemnified Party" and, collectively, the "Indemnified Parties"), from and against any and all

liabilities, damages, losses, costs, expenses (including, without limitation, any and all reasonable attorneys' fees and disbursements), causes of action, suits, liens, claims, damages, penalties, obligations, demands or judgments of any nature, including, without limitation, for death, personal injury and property damage, economic damage, and claims brought by third parties for personal injury and/or property damage (collectively, "Damages"), incurred by any Indemnified Party caused by any negligent act or omission, or intentional misconduct of the Indemnifying Party, its officers, agents, employees (including the County's authorized personnel) arising out of or in connection with this Agreement, except to the extent such Damages are caused by the sole negligence, unlawful act or omission, or intentional misconduct of an Indemnified Party.

- 6. The Town hereby expressly waives and releases any and all claims, now known or hereafter known in any jurisdiction throughout the world, against the County, and its officers, directors, employees, agents, affiliates, successors, and assigns (collectively, "Releasees"), arising out of or attributable to the Town's withdrawal from the Plan, whether arising out of the negligence of the County or any Releasees or otherwise. The Town covenants not to make or bring any such claim against the County or any other Releasee, and forever release and discharge the County and all other Releasees from liability under such claims.
- 7. The County hereby expressly waives and releases any and all claims, now known or hereafter known in any jurisdiction throughout the world, against the Town, and its officers, directors, employees, agents, affiliates, successors, and assigns (collectively, "Releasees"), arising out of or attributable to the Town's withdrawal from the Plan, whether arising out of the negligence of the Town or any Releasees or otherwise. The County covenants not to make or bring any such claim against the Town or any other Releasee, and forever release and discharge the Town and all other Releasees from liability under such claims.
