

Our intentions are to create, more parking for our Town Hall, and possibly make room for a new Town Hall in the future.


We would appreciate any consideration you could give the Town of Florence in our obtaining this property.

New York Cooperative Liquid Assets Securities System (NYCLASS) is a short-term, liquid investment fund, designed specifically for the public sector. NYCLASS provides the opportunity to invest funds on a cooperative basis in short-term investments that are selected to yield favorable returns while striving to provide maximum safety and liquidity. NYCLASS is structured in accordance with New York State General Municipal Law (GML), Article 3-A and Article 5-G, Sections 119-n and o, and Chapter 623 of the Laws of 1998. All NYCLASS investment and custodial policies are in accordance with GML, Sections 10 and 11. Participation is available to any municipal corporation or special-purpose district empowered under NY statute.

The safety and liquidity aspects along with the current interest rate environment make participation in the fund beneficial to the county at this time. We submit for your review the Municipal Cooperation Resolution necessary to begin participation, and ask that you forward it to the Board of Legislators for consideration at their next meeting - June 8, 2022, if possible.



I am submitting the following Purchase of Services Agreement for review and approval by the Board of Legislators.

The Purchase of Services Agreement with the City of Rome through its Police Department provides one Law Enforcement Coordinator specially trained in the Child Advocacy Center's protocols and procedures regarding child abuse cases. The Law Enforcement Coordinator will be assigned to the Center as part of the multidisciplinary team and act as the liaison between the Child Advocacy Center and their respective agency.

The Child Advocacy Center was established in 1990 to provide a multidisciplinary approach to the investigation of child sexual abuse and severe physical abuse. The multidisciplinary team is located at the Center with Child Protective Services, medical providers, victim advocates, counseling, law enforcement and the District Attorney's office.

This Agreement is scheduled to become effective January 1, 2021 through December 31, 2022. The total cost is \$207,361.00, of which the Rome Police Department contributes \$41,472.20 and the Department of Family and Community Services contributes \$165,888.80, with a local share of \$82,944.40.

I am respectfully requesting that this matter be forwarded to the Board of Legislators for action as soon as possible. Thank you for your consideration.

SUMMARY STATEMENTS

1). Narrative Description of Proposed Services

A multidisciplinary team will provide on-site law-enforcement, Caseworkers, victim advocacy, scheduled medical examinations, and counseling to child victims of severe abuse or sexual abuse. The contract allows for (1) Police Officer from the Rome Police Department to act as a Law Enforcement Coordinator dedicated to the Child Advocacy Center.

2). Program/Service Objectives and Outcomes -

The Contractor provides a Law Enforcement Coordinator at the Child Advocacy Center. The Child Advocacy Center allows Oneida County Department of Social Services to:

- Establish a multidisciplinary team consisting of Law Enforcement, District Attorney's Office, Child Protective Services, Medical Providers and counseling and advocacy.

Re: <u>Authorization to Submit Various Funding Applications</u>

Dear County Executive Picente:

New York State (NYS) administers several programs that provide financing and funding for wastewater infrastructure projects. NYS administers wastewater infrastructure funding through the New York State Environmental Facilities Corporation (NYSEFC) and most federal wastewater infrastructure funding, including the new Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL) is being distributed through NYSEFC. The BIL is providing a historical sum of money into the NYS financing and funding programs; the monies are available now and will likely be available for several more years. In order to receive financing and funding through NYS, a community's project must be listed on the Clean Water State Revolving Fund (CWSRF) Annual Intended Use Plan.

Since 2008, Oneida County has been undertaking an extensive number of projects to rehabilitate sanitary sewers and to upgrade the County's major pumping, conveyance, and treatment facilities. This work is required by the Consent Order issued by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation, but more importantly, to address SPDES permit compliance requirements, upgrade aging equipment and infrastructure, and to accommodate residential and economic development growth. To that extent, we have identified four (4) projects that we would like to explore funding opportunities. They include:

Enhanced Sludge Dewatering System - The Water Pollution Control Plant (WPCP) currently dewaters digested sludge solids using belt filter presses, followed by disposal at the Oneida-Herkimer Solid Waste Authority Regional Landfill. Sludge disposal costs have increased sharply in recent years, as have other operations and maintenance costs associated with the current dewatering process. The existing belt filter presses typically only achieve 18 percent total solids (TS) dryness. There is potential for substantial hauling and disposal savings if the sludge was dewatered to a higher percent solids using alternative technologies. A pilot test using centrifuge equipment was conducted at the WPCP in February 2022 and showed favorable results, achieving percent solids greater than 25 percent.

A conversion to centrifuge technology is being proposed to improve dewatering efficiency and reduce hauling and disposal costs. The concept is to install two new centrifuges to replace the two older belt filter presses, ancillary equipment, and an odor control system. Our engineering consultants have conservatively estimated total project cost to be approximately \$8M.

<u>Ultraviolet Effluent Disinfection System</u> - The WPCP's current SPDES permit includes a seasonal total residual chlorine (TRC) effluent limit of 0.03 milligrams per liter (mg/L) daily maximum that will become effective upon completion of the ongoing WPCP upgrades and expansion. The 0.03 mg/L represents the

lowest limit and in practice represents zero TRC in the WPCP effluent. Disinfection is required seasonally between May 1 and October 31. While the WPCP currently utilizes sodium hypochlorite and sodium bisulfite for disinfection (chlorination/dechlorination), ultraviolet (UV) disinfection is being proposed as an alternative to chemical disinfection due to concerns with reliably meeting the stringent TRC SPDES permit effluent limit and rising costs of chemicals.

The concept of this proposed project is to discontinue use of chemical for treated final effluent water and replace that with a UV system. This would entail installing a UV system in one of the existing chlorine contact tanks and constructing a weather-proof enclosure for control panels, spare parts, and storage during the winter months. Our engineering consultants have conservatively estimated the total project cost to be approximately \$6M.

Sauquoit Creek Pumping Station Resiliency Enhancements - The Sanitary Screen Facility at the Sauquoit Creek Pump Station (SCPS) was constructed to replace two antiquated manual bar screens located in the existing SCPS influent channels. The facility, which has been in operation for over two years, is designed for a 38-mgd flow and includes two (2) new 38-mgd rated mechanical bar screens, each paired with designated washer compactor and discharge conveyors for compacted screenings. Despite major reductions in excessive inflow/infiltration from the numerous sewer rehabilitation project undertaken in the Sauquoit Creek Basin service area, actual peak flows at the SCPS appear to be trending upward most likely due to more severe weather and more intense storm events occurring more often than in the past. Managing the extreme peak flows during intense storm events are operational challenges especially when one screen is out of service.

The proposed resiliency enhancements would include the addition of a third channel and screen with associated compactor to improve the systems performance at peak flow and screenings loading. This will provide the screening facility with increased redundancy to improve resilience and performance during high flow conditions. The construction of an equivalently sized channel with optimized flow distribution and similar screening facilities to the existing two channels will serve to minimize operations and maintenance burdens and reduce the risk of potential regulatory violations. Our engineering consultants have estimated total project costs to be approximately \$11M.

Supplemental Collection System Rehabilitation (District-wide) - Since 2008, the County has engaged in collection system rehabilitation projects. These projects were undertaken to reduce the amount of inflow and infiltration (I/I) entering the system due to defects in interceptor sewers, mainline sewers, lateral connections, and manhole structures. Work under these sewer rehabilitation contracts typically included: a mix of cured-in-place-pipe (CIPP) lining; pipe joint and lateral grouting; open cut repairs; spot repairs; manhole repairs/replacement; and supplemental CCTV inspections.

The collection system rehabilitation work has notably reduced the sanitary sewer overflow (SSO) frequency and volume within the Sauquoit Creek Basin. However, even though this SSO frequency and volume has been reduced, I/I in the tributary collection system continues to persist. Additionally, it has been discovered that excessive I/I in the Starch Factory Creek Interceptor Sewer (which serves East Utica and along with portions of the Towns of New Hartford and Frankfort) and North Utica Interceptor Sewer (which serves the Towns of Deerfield, Marcy, and Schuyler along with North Utica and Village of Holland Patent) is substantial during severe wet weather and negatively impacts WPCP operations. Therefore, a supplementary phase of collection system evaluation and rehabilitation is warranted to further identify and reduce I/I.

The concept of a supplementary phase of collection system rehabilitation work would entail: (1) SSES work and (2) collection system rehabilitation construction. The SSES work may include investigation work, such as manhole inspections, television inspection of sewers, smoke testing and dye testing, and flow monitoring. The collection system rehabilitation construction may include a mix of cured-in-place-pipe (CIPP) lining; pipe joint and lateral grouting; open cut repairs; spot repairs; manhole repairs/replacement. Our engineering consultants have conservatively estimated total project cost is \$26M.

There are current and pending grant opportunities available for these potential projects that our Department would like to explore. Submission of funding applications will require Board of Legislators approval. Therefore, I am requesting permission from you and the Board of Legislators for consideration of the following:

- Approval to submit an application to NYSDEC through the 2022 Consolidated Funding Application process for Water Quality Improvement Program (WQIP) grant. This program offers a 40 to 75-percent grant toward construction funding with the balance of cost paid through local match. The application is due July 29, 2022.
- Approval to submit an application to NYSEFC through the 2022 Consolidated Funding Application process for a Green Innovation Grants Program (GIGP) grant. This program offers a 50 to 75-percent grant toward construction funding with the balance of cost paid through local match. The application is due July 29, 2022.
- Approval to submit an application to NYSEFC for a Water Infrastructure Improvement Act (WIIA) grant. This program offers a 25-percent grant toward project costs with the balance being paid through financing. The application due date is anticipated in November 2022.

Formal applications to secure funding under the federal Bipartisan Infrastructure Law are not required. NYSEFC will consider requests for BIL funding in conjunction with the listing of new projects and updates to existing projects on its annual Intended Use Plan (IUP). Oneida County is a participant in NYSEFC's annual IUP update process.

Note that applying for grants and other funding sources does not obligate the County to undertake the project, nor accept the funding, should it be offered. However, actively pursuing available funding sources will assist our Department with both our short- and long-term operational planning.
