WHEREAS, Without the appropriate treatment and services, people with mental illness continue to cycle through the criminal justice system, often resulting in tragic outcomes for these individuals and their families, and

WHEREAS, Oneida County takes pride in its responsibility to protect and enhance the health, welfare and safety of its residents in efficient and cost-effective ways, and

WHEREAS, Oneida County has developed a Forensic Mental Health Program and a Mental Health Court which provide support and services to individuals with mental illness involved in the criminal justice system. These programs are responsible for a marked decline in the recidivism of such individuals, and

WHEREAS, Through the Stepping Up Initiative, NACo, the CSG Justice Center and the APA Foundation are encouraging public, private and nonprofit partners to reduce the number of people with mental illnesses in jails, and
