- WHEREAS, A Public Hearing regarding the revised Oneida County Sanitary Code was held on June 13, 2018 after a Notice of Public Hearing was published in the official newspapers of Oneida County on May 10th and May 17th, 2018, and
- WHEREAS, In accordance with Oneida County Charter, Article XI, Section 1104, said revised Oneida County Sanitary Code must be approved by the Oneida County Board of Legislators, now, therefore, be it hereby
