Section 1002. <u>Powers and Duties of the Commissioner.</u> Except as otherwise provided in this (e) Charter and the (e) Code, the (e) Commissioner of (s) Social (s) Services shall:

- (a) Have all the powers and perform all the duties conferred on or required of a county commissioner of social services under **this Charter**, **the Code**, **and the** (s)Social (s)Services (1)Law or other applicable law.
- (b) Manage and supervise the social services programs or agencies of the (e)County when authorized by the County Executive and approved by resolution of the Board of County Legislators.
- (c) To advise and assist the County Executive in developing policies designed to help meet the needs of the aging and disabled, and to encourage the full participation of the aging in society.
- (d) To coordinate programs and activities relating to the aging and community based long term care.
- (e) To cooperate with and assist other municipalities in the development of local programs for the elderly, disabled and family caregivers.
- (f) To participate in and cooperate with an advisory council known as the OFA/OCC Advisory/Long Term Care Council, whose members are appointed by the County Executive, subject to confirmation by the Board of County Legislators.
- (g) Manage and supervise County youth programs and initiatives as shall be prescribed in the Code or hereafter granted or imposed by this Charter, the Code, local law, ordinance or resolution of the Board of County Legislators, order or direction of the County Executive or any applicable provision or act of the New York State Legislature.
- (h) To annually submit to the County Executive a written report of the activities and recommendations of the Department of Family and Community Services.
- $(\odot \mathbf{i})$ Perform such other related duties as shall be required or delegated to him or her by the County Executive or Board of County Legislators.

- <u>(c)</u> The following positions in the classified service shall be included in the exempt class: (1) deputies who are authorized to act generally for and on behalf of their principals; (2) the (e)Confidential (s)Secretary to any officer or department head; (3) (calendar clerk, personnel officer) Commissioner of Personnel; (4) (a)Assistant (d)District (a)Attorneys; (5) Confidential Criminal Investigators; (6(5)) (a)Assistant (e)County (a)Attorneys; (7(6)) (d)Deputy and (a)Assistant (p)Public (d)Defenders; and (8) all other persons as specifically provided by statute.
- (d) For purposes of this section, the heads of the Youth Bureau and Veterans' Service Agency within the Department of Family and Community Services shall be deemed to be heads of departments.

Section 2501. Department of Office for the Aging and Continuing Care; Director. There shall be an office for the aging and continuing care, the head of which shall be the director of the office for the aging and continuing care, who shall be appointed by the County Executive, subject to the confirmation of the Board of County Legislators. The director so appointed shall serve at the pleasure of the County Executive.

Section 2502. <u>Powers and Duties.</u> The director of the office for the aging and continuing care shall have the following powers and duties:

- (a) To advise and assist the County Executive in developing policies designed to help meet the needs of the aging and disabled and to encourage the full participation of the aging in society.
- (b) To coordinate programs and activities relating to the aging and community based long term care.
- (c) To cooperate with and assist other municipalities in the development of local programs for the elderly, disabled and family caregivers.
- (d) To annually submit to the County Executive a written report of the activities and recommendations of the office for the aging and continuing care.
- (e) To participate in and cooperate with an advisory council known as the OFA/OCC Advisory/Long Term Care Council, whose members are appointed by the County Executive, subject to confirmation by the Board of Legislators.)

The Office for the Aging and Continuing Care was merged into the Department of Family and Community Services.

10. This Local Law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State in accordance with Sections 20, 21 and 27 of the New York State Municipal Home Rule Law.

(and t)<u>Thereafter</u>, the Commissioner of (the <u>Department of</u>)Social Services shall be appointed as provided herein and for the term as set forth in Section 116 of the Social Services Law.

(a) Any person so appointed and confirmed as Commissioner of Social Services(,) shall have at least two years? experience in a full time capacity in business administration, industrial management, or in the field of social welfare.

Section 1002. <u>Powers and Duties of the Commissioner.</u> Except as otherwise provided in the Charter and this Code, the Commissioner of Social Services shall:

- (a) (The Commissioner shall h) Have all the powers and duties and shall be subject to all the obligations and liabilities heretofore or hereafter lawfully imposed by the (e) Charter, this (e) Code, local law, ordinance or resolution of the Board of County Legislators, order or direction of the County Executive, or any applicable provision of any act of the legislature not inconsistent with the (e) Charter or this (e) Code. Such powers, duties, obligations and liabilities shall include, but be not limited to any power, duty, obligation, or liability heretofore or hereafter imposed upon the (e) County Commissioner of Social Services under the Social Services Law or any other applicable statute, not inconsistent with the (e) Charter or this (e) Code.
- (b) Manage and supervise the social services programs or agencies of the County when authorized by the County Executive and approved by resolution of the Board of County Legislators.
- (c) To advise and assist the County Executive in developing policies designed to help meet the needs of the aging and disabled, and to encourage the full participation of the aging in society.
- (d) To coordinate programs and activities relating to the aging and community based long term care.

- (e) To cooperate with and assist other municipalities in the development of local programs for the elderly, disabled and family caregivers.
- (f) To participate in and cooperate with an advisory council known as the OFA/OCC Advisory/Long Term Care Council, whose members are appointed by the County Executive, subject to confirmation by the Board of County Legislators.

- (l) With the consent of the County Executive, advise and assist any city, town, village, school, special or other district in the County in the planning of youth programs.
- (m) To annually submit to the County Executive a written report of the activities and recommendations of the Department of Family and Community Services.
- (n) Perform such other related duties as shall be required or delegated to him by the County Executive or Board of County Legislators.

Section 1003. Reports.

- (a) Such Commissioner shall make such written reports and furnish such information to the New York State Department of Social Services with respect to the work of the (e)County social services district as are required by the Social Services Law and by the State Department of Social Services. Copies thereof shall be filed with the Board of County Legislators and the County Executive.
- (b) Such Commissioner shall make and file on or before the 1st day of March of each year an annual written report to the Board of County Legislators and the County Executive concerning the work of the County social services district and additional reports at such time and covering such matters as the County Executive or Board of **County** Legislators by resolution may require.

Section 100(5)4. <u>Deputy Commissioners</u>. The Commissioner shall, when such positions are authorized by the Board of County Legislators and within the limits of the appropriations provided therefor, have the power to appoint such deputies, officers, assistants, and employees as he may deem necessary for the performance of his duties. The (a) <u>Deputy</u> (e) <u>Commissioners</u> shall act for and on behalf of the Commissioner and shall perform such duties as he may prescribe.

Section 100(6)5. Welfare Rates and Charges. The Commissioner shall, when submitting the estimate of revenues and expenditures for the (d)Department of (social services) to the Budget Director, include therein recommendations for rates to be paid by the (e)County to foster homes and such other rates as may be necessary or required to be paid by the (e)County for services rendered for the care and maintenance of persons for whom the (d)Department (of social services) is responsible under the requirements of the Social Services Law or any other applicable law. Such rates, if and as approved by the County Executive, shall be included in the tentative budget. The Board of County Legislators shall, by resolution and part of the budget procedure, determine, fix and establish the rates to be paid by the (e)County for such services.

Section 100(7)6. Accounting for Fees and Funds.

- (a) All monies to which the (e)County may be entitled under and by virtue of the laws of the State of New York, or which the (e)Commissioner may receive for official services by him, or by any of his deputies, assistants, clerks, employees or subordinates, shall apply to and be for the benefit of the (e)County and shall be collected by such Commissioner of Social Services, accounted for and paid over to the Commissioner of Finance within five (5) days after the expiration of each month. Each such statement shall have attached thereto a certification by said the Commissioner of Social Services to the effect that the same is in all respects a full and true statement of all such monies received by him for the preceding month.
- <u>(1)</u> At the time of rendering any such statement, (such)the Commissioner of Social Services shall pay to the Commissioner of Finance, for the benefit of (said)the (e)County, all monies received by him since the last preceding monthly report. Other funds or fees collected by the Commissioner of Social Services shall be collected, paid over, deposited and reported as above provided, except where otherwise specifically provided by statute.
- ((b) The commissioner shall deposit with the Commissioner of Finance within five (5) days after he has received same, any and all monies received by him for the use of a particular inmate or inmates of the county home.)

Section 100(8)7. Other Duties. The Commissioner shall perform such other duties as may be directed by the Board of County Legislators, the County Executive or by any law or by any officer of the (s)State not inconsistent with the (e)Charter or this (e)Code.

9. That Article XX, Section 2003 of the Oneida County Administrative Code shall be amended by the deletion of all matters that are in parenthesis and (stricken) and the addition of all matters in **bold and underlined** as set forth below:

Section 2003. Additional Appointments by County Executive.

- Subject to confirmation by the Board of County Legislators and except as otherwise provided in the (e)Charter or this (e)Code, the County Executive shall appoint the head of any other or additional administrative unit of the (e)County, including among others but not limited to, the (d)Director of Emergency (management) Services, the (d)Director of the (v)Veterans' (s)Service Agency, the Youth Bureau Director, (f)Fire (e)Coordinators, and the (e)County (h)Historian, all of whom shall be residents of the County of Oneida and serve at the pleasure of the County Executive subject to (confirmation by the Board of Legislators.)
- <u>(b)</u> The Board of County Legislators, as provided in the (e)<u>C</u>harter or <u>this</u> (e)<u>C</u>ode, may continue, consolidate or abolish any of the above units and upon written recommendation of the County Executive grant them departmental status by resolution by the Board of County Legislators.
- (d)Director who shall be appointed by the County Executive, subject to confirmation by the Board of County Legislators on the basis of his administrative experience and (his)qualifications for the duties of (his) such office. He shall have and exercise all the powers and duties heretofore and hereafter lawfully conferred or imposed upon him by the (e)Charter, this (e)Code, ordinance and resolutions of the Board of County Legislators, order or direction of the County Executive, by local law, by the New York State Defense Emergency act being chapter 784 of the laws of 1951, as amended, and by any other applicable law not inconsistent with the (e)Charter or this (e)Code.
- (d) ((b))The Oneida (e)County (v)Veteran's' (s)Service (office) Agency shall be headed by a Director of (v)Veterans' (s)Service (office) Agency who shall be appointed by the County Executive, subject to confirmation by the Board of County Legislators on the basis of his administrative experience and qualifications for the duties of (his)such office. Section 2204. Classified Service, Exemptions.

- <u>(a)</u> All positions in all departments, offices, institutions, and agencies of the (e) <u>C</u>ounty, shall be in the classified service, except those held by the following: (1) elective officers; (2) heads of departments; (3) the (m) <u>M</u>edical \in <u>E</u>xaminer; (4) the (e) <u>C</u>ommissioner of (j) <u>J</u>urors; (5) all officers and employees of the Board of County Legislators; (6) all members, officers and employees of the Board of Elections; and (7) all other persons as specifically prescribed by statute.
- <u>(b)</u> For the purpose of this section, the heads of the divisions within the $\underbrace{\mathbf{E}}_{\mathbf{E}}$ xecutive (b) $\underline{\mathbf{B}}_{\mathbf{E}}$ ranch, including but not limited to (b) $\underline{\mathbf{B}}_{\mathbf{E}}$ udget, (p) $\underline{\mathbf{P}}_{\mathbf{E}}$ urchase, (Central Services) $\underline{\mathbf{Information}}_{\mathbf{E}}$ $\underline{\mathbf{E}}_{\mathbf{E}}$ and (t) $\underline{\mathbf{E}}_{\mathbf{E}}$ raffic (s) $\underline{\mathbf{E}}_{\mathbf{E}}$ afety (and the Youth and related programs), shall be deemed to be the heads of departments.
- The following positions in the classified service shall be included in the exempt class: (1) deputies who are authorized to act generally for and on behalf of their principals; (2) the (e)Confidential (s)Secretary to any officer or department head; (3) (personnel officer) Commissioner of Personnel; (4) (a)Assistant (d)District (a)Attorneys (and); (5) Confidential Criminal Investigators; ($\underline{6}(5)$) (a)Assistant (e)County (a)Attorneys; ($\underline{7}(6)$) Deputy and Assistant Public Defenders; and (8) all other persons as specifically provided by statute.
- (d) For purposes of this section, the heads of the Youth Bureau and related programs, and Veterans' Service Agency within the Department of Family and Community Services shall be deemed to be heads of departments.
- (Not withstanding) Notwithstanding any other provision of the Charter or this © Code or charter, wherever the appointment of a deputy is authorized, such deputy is hereby authorized to act generally for and in place of his principal and the same shall be deemed to be in the exempt class of the classified service of civil service.
- 11. That Article XXV of the Oneida County Administrative Code shall be amended by the deletion of all matters that are in parenthesis and (stricken) and the addition of all matters in **bold and underlined** as set forth below:

ARTICLE XXV OFFICE FOR THE AGING AND CONTINUING CARE

(Section 2501. Office for the Aging and Continuing Care; Director

(c) To cooperate with and other municipalities in the development of local programs for the elderly, disabled and family caregivers.
(d) To annually submit to the County Executive a written report of the activities and recommendations of the office for the aging and continuing care.
(e) To participate in and cooperate with an advisory council known as the OFA/OCC Advisory/Long term Care Council, whose members are appointed by the County Executive, subject to confirmation by the Board of Legislators.)
