Citizen Preparedness

Household Emergency Plan

Meet with household members to discuss emergencies such as fire, severe weather, chemical hazards

- Learn how to respond to different hazards
- Plan two escape routes
- Identify safe locations in your home for each hazard
- Discuss what to do for power outages
- Discuss what to do for personal injuries
- Post emergency telephone numbers near the telephones
- Teach children when to call 9-1-1
- Instruct household members to turn on the radio for emergency information
- Select contacts if household members are separated during an emergency (contacts should include one out-of-state person and one local person)
- Pick two emergency meeting places
- a place near your home in case of a fire.
- a place outside your neighborhood in case you cannot return home after a disaster

Keep important records in a water and fire-proof container
