#### **HOCTS Resolution 2024 - 01**

#### Approval of the HOCTC Public Participation Plan 2024

- WHEREAS, the Governmental Policy and Liaison Committee has been designated by the Governor of New York State as the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) responsible, together with the State, for the continuous, cooperative, and comprehensive transportation planning and programming processes for the urbanized areas of Herkimer and Oneida Counties; and
- WHEREAS, Title 23 CFR 450.316(a)(1) et al, provides that the MPOs must prepare a participation plan to describe the process to ensure all citizens have reasonable opportunities to be involved in transportation planning, defines the segments of population to be included in that process, and further describes the means, methods and formats used in providing those opportunities; and
- WHEREAS, consistent with the declaration of the above provisions, the Herkimer Oneida Counties Transportation Council (HOCTC) as staff to the GP&L Committee, in consultation with the New York State Department of Transportation, has prepared a draft Public Participation Plan 2024; and
- WHEREAS, pursuant to Title 23 CFR 450.316(a)(3), the MPO has provided a public comment period of forty-five (45) days for review of the draft Public Participation Plan 2024 prior to final MPO approval; and
- WHEREAS, in meeting the requirements of Title 23 CFR 450.316(a)(1)(ix), the MPO agrees to periodically review the effectiveness of procedures and strategies intended to provide a full and open public involvement process to all; and
- NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Governmental Policy and Liaison Committee accepts this HOCTC Public Participation Plan 2024 as the current policy for outreach efforts of the MPO; and

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that the GP&L Committee hereby directs the Chairman to communicate this document to the appropriate State and Federal officials in the prescribed manner.

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**HOCTC** Resolution 2024 – 02

Approval of the 2024 – 2025 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP)

- WHEREAS, as carried forward in the Infrastructure & Investment Jobs Act (IIJA) passed November 2021 and prescribed in the FAST Act, the FAST Act authorized the use of funds for the Metropolitan Planning Organization to carry out transportation planning requirements and responsibilities; and
- WHEREAS, Federal regulations (23 CFR Chapter 1, Part 450, Subpart C, and 49 CFR Chapter VI, Part 613, Subpart B) require that the urban transportation planning process shall include the development of a Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) which shall annually describe all urban transportation and transportation planning activities anticipated, and will document the work to be performed with technical assistance provided under the Fixing Americas Surface Transportation (FAST) Act, the Clean Air Act Amendments of 1990, Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, Section 5303 Program; and
- WHEREAS, the Herkimer Oneida Counties Transportation Council (HOCTC) has been designated by the Governor of New York State as the Metropolitan Planning Organization responsible for the comprehensive, continuous, and coordinated transportation planning process for the metropolitan planning area encompassing Herkimer and Oneida Counties; and
- WHEREAS, HOCTC staff developed the 2024 2025 UPWP through the continuous, comprehensive, and cooperative transportation planning process in coordination with state, regional, and local agencies and officials; and
- WHEREAS, the Transportation Planning Committee and Governmental Policy & Liaison Committee have worked with HOCTC staff to develop a recommended UPWP so that the latest draft submitted herewith represents an accurate description of work to be undertaken and funds to be made available; and

- **WHEREAS**, the 2024 2025 UPWP was legally advertised for public review in accordance with HOCTC PPP and all applicable regulations, with the review period closing on February 14, 2024; and
- NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Governmental Policy and Liaison Committee endorses and hereby adopts the 2024 2025 UPWP for the Herkimer-Oneida Counties Transportation Council, as recommended by the Transportation Planning Committee; and
- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Governmental Policy & Liaison Committee authorizes the HOCTC Director to make necessary schedule revisions, project refinements, and provide task-specific direction to HOCTC staff to carry out the work program; and
- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Governmental Policy and Liaison Committee certifies that the requirements of 23 CFR Part 450.114 (c) have been met; and
- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Governmental Policy and Liaison Committee authorizes transmittal of this 2024 2025 UPWP to the NYS Department of Transportation for submission to the Federal Highway Administration to secure highway planning funds on behalf of HOCTC; and
- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Governmental Policy and Liaison Committee authorizes transmittal of this 2024 2025 UPWP to the NYS Department of Transportation to be used for an application to the Federal Transit Administration to obtain transit planning funds on behalf of HOCTC; and
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Governmental Policy and Liaison Committee also authorizes submittal of the 2024 2025 UPWP to the statewide and area wide clearinghouses to fulfill any federal and state review requirements for the identified work herein to be carried out and the federal, state, and local funds to be used; and
- **BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED**, that the Governmental Policy and Liaison Committee hereby directs the Chairman to communicate this action to the appropriate State and Federal officials in the prescribed manner.

#### Amendment to the 2023 – 2027 TIP to revise a Traffic Systems Improvement Project

- **WHEREAS**, the Governmental Policy & Liaison Committee (GP&L) has previously approved the 2023 2027 TIP; and
- **WHEREAS,** a TIP amendment is required when State or Federal Aid funded projects are revised on the existing project list; and
- NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that PIN 2806.55 Traffic Systems Improvement Project 24, shall be revised on the TIP. This project involves 1) the modernization of the signals systems at several locations across the region, 2) to provide highway safety benefits, 3) improve equipment reliability, and 4) addresses signal systems issues as needed; and

The \$.312M shall be moved to PIN 2806.52 and the Signal work from PIN 2806.55 will now be done under PIN 2806.52 contingent with Resolution 2024-03B; and
- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the GP&L Committee amends the 2023 2027 TIP to revise the PIN, as described above and shown on the accompanying table; and

#### **HOCTC** Resolution 2024 – 06

Amendment the HOCTC Coordinated Public Transit and Human Services Transportation Plan 2021 – 2024 to update Appendix 1

- WHEREAS, the Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient Transportation Equity Act: A Legacy for Users (SAFETEA-LU) transportation reauthorization was signed into law on August 10, 2005 requiring federal grantees to "locally develop a coordinated transit-human services transportation plan" that directs the coordination among recipients of federal funds for human services transportation, and to update that Plan every four years; and
- WHEREAS, the federal transportation legislations Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century (MAP-21) in 2012, Fixing America's Surface Transportation Act (FAST Act) in December 2015, and the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) of 2021, uphold and expand the requirement of the locally developed coordinated plan; and
- WHEREAS, the U.S. Department of Transportation requires the development of a Human Service Coordinated Transportation Plan for each urbanized area under the direction of a Metropolitan Planning Organization in accordance with 49 USC 5303; and
- WHEREAS, the Herkimer-Oneida Counties Transportation Council (HOCTC) has developed a locally derived coordinated transit-human services transportation plan through a process that included representatives from public, private, non-profit transportation services, human service providers, interested parties, and the general public, that was previously approved by the GP&L in December 2021; and
- WHEREAS, the HOCTC Transportation Coordination Committee (TCC), which includes representatives from public, private and non-profit agencies, and human services transportation providers,

developed the Section 5310 project listing, known as Appendix 1 of the Coordinated Plan, of potential projects to be undertaken by member agencies, as funding (Federal, State, and local) becomes available; and

- WHEREAS, the Appendix 1 project list is illustrative and may be modified annually, and as needed, to ensure projects adhere to funding source requirements and collaboration between agencies is occurring; and
- WHEREAS, Appendix 1 shall be amended to include two additional projects, which are for Katherine Luther Residential Health Care & Rehabilitation Center, and The Arc, Oneida-Lewis Chapter; and
- NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the GP&L Committee hereby approves the amendment to the Coordinated Public Transit - Human Services Transportation Plan 2021 – 2024 to update Appendix 1, as described above; and

#### 2. Agency: The Arc, Oneida-Lewis Chapter

Requesting:

The Arc, Oneida-Lewis Chapter intends to purchase three (2) Lot K and three (2) Lot F replacement buses in 2024, to be used for daily transportation to and from day programs for adults with intellectual disabilities. Persons using these buses/vans are not only intellectually disabled; many have physical disabilities, are elderly and need support of staff for transport.

Project Description:

The buses will replace existing buses, beyond their useful life to be used by The Arc, using in-house drivers with fixed route providing transportation services to persons who cannot use public transportation, private bus or taxi service for the following reasons:

- in some instances, no public transportation exists;
- taxi service, where it is available, would be cost prohibitive;
- many of the people who would use the buses are non-ambulatory and require vehicles equipped with lifts and tie downs, along with door to door service;
- many persons are severely disabled and cannot be taught to travel safely on their own; and
- many persons are on strict medication regimes and require a provider such as The Arc who cannot only coordinate transportation/medication effort, but has a great deal of experience doing so.

#### Coordination

Efforts:

Coming out of the Pandemic, The Arc is providing transportation services with our own agency drivers on staff in Oneida County using buses procured through the 5310 DOT grant funding. We coordinate with families and the public transportation system when feasible to do so.
