

Oneida County Health Department collaborated with Community Health & Behavioral Services and ACR Health to install a "Public Health Kiosk"- the first-of-its-kind in the US. Fentanyl has changed the way we need to respond to the overdose epidemic: it's being mixed in every type of street drug (including non-opioids such as cocaine, methamphetamine, and counterfeit prescription pills) in unknown toxic amounts and it takes just one time to kill. More than ever, communities need easy access to harm reduction supplies such as Naloxone (or brand name Narcan).




Physician Reference for Cyanobacterial Blooms



People can become ill from cyanobacteria or their toxins through ingestion, direct skin contact, or inhalation. There are no clinically available diagnostic tests for cyanotoxins or treatments for illnesses caused by cyanobacterial blooms, but you can help relieve patients' symptoms by providing supportive medical care.

Individuals may also be eligible for a Cooling Assistance HEAP benefit through New York State.

New York State Public Health Law and Regulations Lead Poisoning Prevention and Control

Providers are required to:

- * Test all children at age 1 year and again at age 2 with a blood lead test.
- * At every well child visit, assess all children ages 6 months to 6 years for risk of lead exposure. Also get a blood lead test if there is a positive response to ANY guestions in Does Your Child Need a Lead Test?
- * Report point-of-care blood lead test results to the NYS DOH in accordance with guidance.
- * Give the child's parent or guardian of the child the result of the blood lead test. You may also give them this helpful information What Your Child's Blood Lead Test Means.
- * Provide anticipatory guidance to all parents or guardians of children as part of routine care, which may include the Lead Poisoning is a Danger for Every Baby and Child.
